



POST-GAME NOTES

2016 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament Thursday, Mar. 10 // Las Vegas // MGM Grand Arena Final Score: #4 Arizona 82, #5 Colorado 78

- With today's victory, Arizona will face the No. 1 seed Oregon tomorrow at 6:15 p.m.
- Four seeds are now 20-17 all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament.
- Arizona reaches the conference tournament semifinals for the sixth consecutive season and 13th time in 19 tourney trips. The Wildcats have advanced to the championship game nine times in total (five titles), and in four of the previous five tournaments (2011, 2012, 2014, 2015), going 1-3 in those contests (Pac-12 champions in 2015).
- Kaleb Tarczewski is now the winningest player in Arizona basketball history with 110 career victories. He breaks Matt Muehlebach's previous mark of 109.
- Arizona went 32-44 at the foul line, tying the Pac-12 Tournament record for free throw attempts by one team (25-44 STAN vs. UCLA, 3-11-89). Colorado went 21-25 at the line, for a combined 53 made free throws equaling the Pac-12 Tournament record mark of 53 set by Washington (29) and Arizona State (24) on March 10, 2005.
- Arizona's Allonzo Trier sure likes playing against Colorado. In his two career games against the Buffaloes, he is averaging 19 points while shooting 52.2%. Trier now has eight 20-point games and has led Arizona in scoring eight times.
- The Wildcats are now 20-3 when leading at halftime, 22-4 when making more free throws than the opponent and 16-2 when scoring 80+ points.
- Arizona allowed just 20 points in the first half. That is the first time all season that Arizona has allowed 20 points or fewer in the first half. It is also the second-fewest it has allowed in a half all season (NAU had 13 in the second half on Dec. 16). 20 points is also the second-fewest Colorado has scored in a half all season.
- Colorado dominated the offensive glass today as it finished with 25 offensive rebounds today, a new season-high. Before today, Arizona hadn't allowed more than 18 offensive rebounds in one game. Colorado turned those 25 offensive rebounds into 26 second-chance points, which was 33% of its total points.
- Although Arizona allowed 14 offensive rebounds in the second half, it was able to keep the lead the entire game as it went 30-38 from the charity stripe in the second half.
- Colorado is now 19-6 when outrebounding its opponent and Arizona moves to 3-0 when being outrebounded.
- The Buffs scored 58 second-half points after scoring 20 in the first half. The Wildcats hadn't allowed that many points in one half all season.
- Ryan Anderson recorded his team-high 17th double-double of the season with 17 points and 11 rebounds.
- Kaleb Tarczewski grabbed 11 rebounds in today's game. He has now cleaned the glass for double-digit rebounds in seven of his last 11 games.
- Arizona blocked 11 shots today, a new season-high.
- It took Colorado 13:50 to hit double-digit points in the first half. Josh Scott had eight of its first 10 points and was the only one to make a basket. After being held scoreless in the first half yesterday, he scored 10 of Colorado's 20 first-half points.
- The last time the Wildcats and the Buffs faced off, Arizona made just three shots from behind the arc. Arizona drilled five shots from three in just the first half and had six for the game.
- Josh Scott recorded his 12th double-double of the season - his first since a Jan. 20 loss at Washington - as he scored 16 points and grabbed 13 boards. Scott now has 35 career double-doubles, which is tied for the sixth-most in Colorado history with Scott Wedman.
- Scott finished with two blocks today and now has the second-most blocks (162) in Colorado history trailing only David Harrison's 225 from 2001-04.
