



POST-GAME NOTES

2017 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament
Wednesday, Mar. 8 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena
Final Score: #8 Arizona State 98, #9 Stanford 88 (OT)

- With today's win, Arizona State will play top seeded Oregon in the Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinals Thursday at Noon.
- Arizona State is now 7-18 all-time in the Pac-12 Tournament, including 2-3 against Stanford and 4-3 as an eight seed.
- The Sun Devils are now 3-0 on the season against Stanford after sweeping the Cardinal during the regular season. This was the sixth time ASU faced a team in the conference tournament after sweeping them in the regular season, and the Sun Devils are now 6-0 in those games.
- The last time a Pac-12 Tournament first-round game went to overtime was in 2013 when Arizona State and Stanford also went to overtime in the first game of the event. Eighth-seeded Arizona State beat ninth-seeded Stanford, 89-88, that day.
- Arizona State's 98 points are tied for the third-most in tournament history, behind only USC's 103 in 2002 and UCLA's 99 in 1987.
- After scoring just five points in the final eight minutes of regulation, Arizona State scored 17 points in overtime, which included 11 points in the first two-and-a-half minutes of the extra session. The Sun Devils started the frame 5-5 from the field and 3-3 from downtown.
- The Sun Devils hit the 90-point mark for the fifth time this season and the first time since Dec. 30 when they scored 98 against Stanford in the Pac-12 opener.
- Arizona State's Obinna Oleka recorded his 16th double-double this season (career-high 27 points and 13 rebounds), which are the most by a Sun Devil in the Pac-12 era. Oleka has a streak of four consecutive double-doubles and is averaging 15.6 points and 10.0 rebounds over his last five games.
- Tra Holder hit the 20-point mark for the 13th time this season as he poured in 21 points. He shot 8-12 from the field (.667), which is the highest percentage he has shot all season and ties his season-high for field goals made in a game.
- Kodi Justice scored 15 points and is averaging 18.3 points in his last four contests and also is averaging four made threes in his last four contests.
- Shannon Evans II, Holder and Justice all played 40+ minutes and set new career-highs for minutes played in one game.
- 96 of Arizona State's 98 points came from its starting five. Each starter scored at least 15 points and Oleka led the way with 27.
- Arizona State scored 50 points in the first half for the fifth time this season and the first time since Dec. 30 when it scored 52 against none other than Stanford in the Pac-12 opener.
- In their first meeting back on Dec. 30, Arizona State shot 17-29 (59%) from the field in the first half and shot 15-25 (60%) in today's first half.
- After sinking three 3-pointers today, Torian Graham is the eighth player in Pac-12 history to make at least 100 threes in a season. He has 101 this year.
- Reid Travis scored 23 points today, which is the 10th time this season he has eclipsed the 20-point mark.
- Michael Humphrey scored 18 points today, including the last-seconds shot that sent the game into overtime. That is the most he has scored since going for 21 against Oregon State on Jan. 19.
- Dorian Pickens has now hit multiple three-pointers in 19 games this season, including eight of his last nine games. He made four from downtown today.
