



POST-GAME NOTES

2017 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament
Wednesday, Mar. 8 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena
Final Score: #7 Colorado 73, #10 Washington State 63

- With today's win, Colorado will play the No. 2 seed Arizona in the Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinals Thursday at 6 p.m.
- With #7 seed Colorado's win, the last 22 Pac-12 Tournament games have gone according to seed, going back to Game 4 of the 2015 event.
- Colorado is now 10-4 all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament, including a 1-0 record as the seventh-seed and a 2-0 record against Washington State.
- Derrick White had a big game for Colorado as he scored 26 points. He caught fire right after halftime and got the Buffs back into the game as he scored 13 points in the first six minutes of the second half. White has now scored at least 20 points in 13 games this year.
- Xavier Johnson had a big second half as he scored 12 points in the final period to give him 19 for the game. He is now 11th on the Colorado all-time scoring list with 1,430 points.
- White and Johnson combined for 45 points, 62 percent of Colorado's offensive production tonight.
- Wesley Gordon is now tied for third all-time in Colorado history with 120 career starts and is tied for fifth with 129 games played.
- Colorado dug itself a hole in the first half and trailed by as many as 19 (30-11) and 41-27 at the break. CU outscored Washington State 29-11 in the first 13 minutes of the second half to take a 56-52 lead. They would end up winning the second half 46-22.
- Colorado's 14-point halftime deficit was the largest halftime deficit overcome in a Pac-12 Tournament game since 2009, when USC came back from a 39-24 halftime deficit to beat Arizona State in the final, 66-63.
- Josh Hawkinson scored 12 points and grabbed 12 rebounds. With that, he is now 10th all-time in Washington State history with 1,414 points and has 315 total boards this season, which is the fourth-most any Cougar has had in one season. The Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year owns the school record with 55 career double-doubles. He finishes his career 12th on the Pac-12 all-time rebounding list with 1,015 career caroms.
- Ike Iroegbu tied his season-high with three 3-pointers today. The senior scored 16 points and finishes eighth all-time in Washington State history with 375 career assists.
- It took just over six minutes for WSU's Charles Callison to hit double-figures. He would finish the game with a team-high 16 points.
- Washington State had three players score 10 points in the first half (Conor Clifford, Iroegbu & Callison). That trio combined to shoot 14-18 in the first half. The Cougars never had more than two double-figure scorers in the first half during Pac-12 play.
- The Cougars scored 30 points in the first 13 minutes of the game and were up 30-11 at the seven-minute mark of the first half. They would end the half with 41 points. That is the fourth time this season Washington State has scored at least 40 points in the first half.
- After shooting 57 percent in the first half, WSU went cold and shot 31% from the field in the second half.
