



# POST-GAME NOTES

2017 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament  
Wednesday, Mar. 8 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena  
Final Score: #6 USC 78, #11 Washington 73

- With tonight's win, USC will play the No. 3 seed UCLA in the Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinals Thursday at 8:30 p.m.
- USC is now 16-16 all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament, including 4-2 as the sixth-seed and 1-0 against Washington.
- The last 23 Pac-12 Tournament games have gone according to seed dating to Game 4 of the 2015 tourney.
- Pac-12 Most Improved Player Chimezie Metu has scored in double figures and grabbed at least six rebounds in 25 games this season as he poured in 24 points and brought down nine boards against the Huskies. He is averaging 15.0 points and 8.1 rebounds in his last seven games. He eclipsed the 20-point mark for the fourth time this season.
- Bennie Boatwright saw his streak of eight games of double-figure scoring end against Washington last week, but he started a new one tonight as he scored 13 points.
- Jordan McLaughlin dished out six dimes today and is averaging 8.8 over his last four games.
- USC has posted 10+ steals in a game eight times this season after swiping 15 tonight, tying a season-high. The Trojans averaged 13.3 steals in three games against the Huskies this season.
- USC took its first lead at the 17:23 mark of the second half and didn't relinquish it.
- The Trojans outscored Washington 18-8 on points off turnovers and 24-9 at the foul line.
- It marks just the second time this season that USC won after allowing its opponent to shoot at least 50 percent from the field.
- After scoring six total points against the L.A. schools in the final week of the regular season, including zero against USC, Washington's David Crisp scored 22 points and hit four 3-pointers for the seventh time this season. He reached the 20-point mark for the fifth time in his career.
- Along with his 22 points, Crisp grabbed eight rebounds and dished out seven assists. That is the first time this season he has had a 20-5-5 game.
- UW's Noah Dickerson reached double-figure scoring for the 11th-straight game as he scored 18 points tonight. He averaged 19.6 points over his last five games of the season.
- Washington's Malik Dime was a wall on the defensive end as he blocked six of USC's shots tonight, matching the Pac-12 Tournament record first set by Stanford's Josh Huestis against Arizona State in 2013. That ties a season-high for Dime and is one short of his career-high. He also scored in double-figures for the third time this season and the first time since Nov. 25 with 10 points.
- Matisse Thybulle has started 65 straight games for Washington, which is the longest streak since C.J. Wilcox started 66 straight. He also recorded three straight 3-pointers in the first half and has now hit at least three from long distance in six games this season, including the last three outings.
- Washington shot 54 percent from the field, which is the seventh-highest mark of the season for the Dawgs. It is also the eighth time this season UW shot 50 percent or better.
