



POST-GAME NOTES

2017 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament
Thursday, Mar. 9 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena
Final Score: #1 Oregon 80, #8 Arizona State 57

- With today's win, Oregon will play the winner of the No. 4/5 matchup between Utah and California in the Pac-12 semifinals Friday at 6 p.m.
- Oregon is now 25-14 all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament, including 5-1 as the top seed, 3-0 against Arizona State and 12-4 under Dana Altman.
- In the 16 years since the conference tournament returned back in 2002, Oregon has advanced past its first game 12 times.
- The higher seed has won the last 24 games of the Pac-12 Tournament going back to Game 4 of the 2015 tourney.
- The Pac-12 Player of the Year Dillon Brooks was his usual self as he poured in a team-high 22 points today. He is now 13th all-time on the Oregon scoring list with 1,501 career points and is 10 points behind Aaron Brooks for 12th. Additionally, his 657 points this season are the third-most any Duck has scored in one season.
- Tyler Dorsey was also very productive for Oregon as he put 21 points on the board. The sophomore also brought down a career-high nine rebounds. That is the fifth time this season Dorsey has eclipsed the 20-point mark.
- Dylan Ennis was all over the floor for Oregon as he scored seven points, grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds and dished out five assists.
- Oregon finished the last seven minutes on a 20-5 run. The Ducks outscored the Sun Devils by 20 points (46-26) in the second half, which is the second-highest margin in any second half for Oregon this season.
- It marks the 16th time this season that Oregon has scored at least 80 points. Additionally, Oregon is averaging 86.5 points over its last four Pac-12 Tournament games.
- Oregon outrebounded Arizona State by 19 (48-25) today. That is the third-largest rebounding margin for the Ducks this season.
- The Ducks blocked four shots today to climb to 216 this season, five away from tying the Oregon single-season record for most blocks in a season. They are also eight shy of the Pac-12 record of 224 set by Washington in 2015-16.
- Oregon is 91-6 in the last five seasons when holding its opponent under 70 points.
- Oregon has made at least one three-pointer in 667 consecutive games. The last time its failed to make one was back on Feb. 6, 1997 against Washington.
- Torian Graham was a one-man wrecking crew for the Sun Devils and was the main reason the game was close at halftime as he scored 16 of Arizona State's 31 first-half points. The senior finished the game with a career-high 32 points while no other Sun Devil scored more than seven. Graham was two points shy of Jahii Carson's ASU Pac-12 Tournament record. 32 points is also tied for the seventh-most points scored in a single game in conference tournament history.
- Graham got hot early as he hit four of his first five 3-point attempts. He finished the game with seven made threes, which is tied for the second-most in conference tournament history and is the most any Sun Devil has ever made in the conference tourney. It also ties his career-high. Graham made 108 trey balls this season, which are the sixth-most in one season by a Pac-12 player, though UCLA's Bryce Alford (104) is eighth and still active.
- Much like last game, the Sun Devils seemed to run out of gas as they scored just five points in the final seven minutes. Against Stanford, Arizona State scored five points in the final eight minutes of regulation.
