



POST-GAME NOTES

2017 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament
Friday, Mar. 10 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena
Final Score: #1 Oregon 73, #5 California 65

- With today's win, Oregon will play the winner of the No. 2/3 matchup between Arizona and UCLA in the Pac-12 Tournament championship game Saturday at 8 p.m. PT on ESPN.
- Oregon is now 26-14 all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament, including 6-1 as the No. 1 seed, 3-2 against California and 13-4 under head coach Dana Altman. This is the third straight year and fourth time in the last five years that Oregon has advanced all the way to the Pac-12 title game.
- Tyler Dorsey got Oregon going when the Ducks struggled to score in the first half. He started the game 6-8 from the field, while the rest of the team was 8-23. The sophomore finished with 23 points. That is the sixth time Dorsey has scored 20 points this year and is also the first time this year he has scored 20 points in back-to-back games.
- In five Pac-12 Tournament games, Dorsey is averaging 20.6 points and is 14-of-27 (52%) from three-point range.
- Jordan Bell was a monster on the defensive end as he blocked five shots and tied his career-high with 15 rebounds, 14 on the defensive end. 15 rebounds is the fifth-highest rebounding total in Conference Tournament history.
- Dylan Ennis scored 16 points tonight, which is the most he has scored since Feb. 18 when he had 20 against Colorado. He also was 9-9 from the charity stripe, which ties his career-high.
- Oregon set the school single-season record for blocks as it swatted seven tonight. On the year, the Ducks have a total of 223, one shy of the Pac-12 record of 224 set by Washington in 2015-16. This is the fifth time in seven seasons under coach Dana Altman that Oregon has broken the school record for blocked shots.
- The Ducks have hit at least one three-pointer in 668 consecutive games. The last time they failed to do so was back in 1997.
- Oregon is 92-6 in the last five seasons when holding opponents to under 70 points.
- Cal senior Grant Mullins had his best game of the season as he scored a season-high 23 points. He was red hot from the field as he shot 7-8 overall and was 5-5 from behind the arc. That is the first time all season that Mullins shot 100 percent from downtown.
- Mullins has made multiple three-pointers in 13 straight games after making five today. On the season, he has 69 made threes, which is the 10th-most in a single season by a Golden Bear.
- Charlie Moore scored 15 points and has 414 total points during his freshman campaign, which is the eighth-most in Cal history for a freshman. He also hit three treys tonight to give him 45 this year, which is fifth for any Cal freshman. Moore has 22 double-figure outings this season.
- Kingsley Okoroh blocked three shots tonight to give him 70 on the season, which ties David Kravish for the most in a single season in Cal history.
- California failed to convert on a field goal attempt in the final 2:57 of the game.
