



# POST-GAME NOTES

2017 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament  
Friday, Mar. 10 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena  
Final Score: #2 Arizona 86, #3 UCLA 75

- With today's win, Arizona will play Oregon in the Pac-12 Tournament championship game Saturday at 8 p.m. PT on ESPN.
- This is the fourth time in a row that the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds will face off in the championship of the Pac-12 Tournament. Additionally, two AP top 10 ranked teams will meet in the Pac-12 Tournament title game for the first time - #5 Oregon vs. #7 Arizona.
- Arizona is now 30-14 all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament, including an 8-1 record as the No. 2 seed and a 4-5 record against UCLA. This is the third time in four years that Arizona has played in the Pac-12 Tournament title game. The Wildcats are the first team to reach 30 Conference tournament wins.
- Tonight's attendance of 19,224 is the highest single-session mark in Conference tournament history.
- Arizona freshman Lauri Markkanen doubled down on his performance from Thursday as he scored 29 points while making four 3-pointers. He is the first Wildcat to score at least 20 points in his first two Conference tournament games. The Finnish sensation was one point shy of his career-high.
- Coming into the Pac-12 Tournament, Markkanen was 7-35 from downtown in his previous 10 games. In two Pac-12 Tournament games, the freshman is 8-17 from deep. He also tied Salim Stoudamire's freshman record for most points in a Conference tournament game.
- Arizona's Allonzo Trier got off to another good start as he scored 13 first-half points. He finished the game with 20 points and is averaging 19.5 points in four career Pac-12 Tournament games. Over his last six games overall, Trier has scored 22 points per game while shooting just over 50 percent. Additionally, Trier has faced UCLA five times in his career and is averaging 18.2 points in those contests.
- Parker Jackson-Cartwright's 21 assists to just six turnovers (3.5 assist/turnover ratio) in his seven career appearances against UCLA is his second-highest assist/turnover ratio among any other Pac-12 opponent. He has also made 20 of his last 31 three-point attempts over his last 14 contests.
- Arizona is now 10-4 in its second game of the Pac-12 Tournament.
- Last time out, UCLA had 20 second-chance points on 14 offensive rebounds. Tonight, UCLA had just six second-chance points on 12 offensive rebounds.
- The Bruins shot 4-25 (16 percent) from three, which is their lowest percentage all season.
- Arizona shot 7-13 from downtown in the first half. That is the third time this season Arizona has made seven in the first half with the last being on Jan. 21 when they made seven against UCLA. Seven are the most the Wildcats have made in one half. The Wildcats finished with 10 threes, which is the third-most they have made in Conference tournament history.
- Isaac Hamilton and TJ Leaf paced the Bruins as they scored 21 of UCLA's 35 first-half points. Leaf finished with 15 points while Hamilton scored 20.
- Hamilton averaged 21 points in his two games at the Pac-12 Tournament this year. He seems to enjoy playing at the Pac-12 Tournament as he scored 36 points against USC in the 2015 tournament, which is the fifth-most in Conference Tournament history.
- Lonzo Ball had six assists tonight and is two shy of the UCLA single-season record of 256, which was set by Larry Drew II in 2013.
- TJ Leaf fouled out for the first time in his career.
