



# POST-GAME NOTES

2018 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament  
Thursday, March 8 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena  
Final Score: #1 Arizona 83, #8 Colorado 67

- With today's win, Arizona will face the winner of the UCLA-Stanford game tomorrow in the semifinals at 6 p.m. PT.
- Arizona is now 32-14 all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament and 5-1 vs. Colorado. Additionally, it is 16-4 as a No. 1 seed in the conference tournament, which it has been eight times.
- The Wildcats have won at least one game in the Pac-12 Tournament in eight straight years. It is also the sixth year in a row the No. 1 seed has won at least one game. The last No. 1 seed to lose its first game was Washington back in 2012.
- Arizona has won nine of its last 11 Pac-12 Tournament games and has won four in a row after winning the title in 2017.
- All five of Arizona's starters scored in double-figures today. That is the third time this season all five starters have scored 10-or-more, the first time since Jan. 17. The last time the lineup of Jackson-Cartwright, Trier, Alkins, Ayton and Ristic scored in double-figures was on Jan. 13.
- Arizona is 17-0 when outshooting its opponent from three and is 15-2 when scoring at least 80 points.
- Allonzo Trier was extremely efficient today, scoring 22 points on 5-9 shooting and 10-10 from the charity stripe. That is the fifth time this season he has scored at least 20 points while taking fewer than 10 shots.
- Trier, the 2017 Pac-12 Tournament Most Outstanding Player, hit 10 free throws for the fifth time this season, going 10-10 from the line. It is also the third time he made 10+ free throws without missing an attempt.
- Trier now averages 20.5 points per game in six career Pac-12 Tournament games.
- Dusan Ristic has now scored at least 10 points in 13 of his last 15 games after recording his first Pac-12 Tournament double-double with 16 points and 11 rebounds. In his last 15 games, the senior is averaging 14.2 points and 7.3 rebounds. Ristic now has seven double-doubles on the season.
- Parker Jackson-Cartwright is five assists shy of cracking the top 10 in Arizona history after dishing out four today. He has 450 career helpers in his four years in Tucson. PJC's 14 points is a Pac-12 Tournament high for him.
- Rawle Alkins tied his career-high with a new season-high four steals today. He helped the Wildcats force 11 steals today, which is their second-most of the 2017-18 season. The season-high 12 steals also came against Colorado on Jan. 6.
- Eleven steals is the fourth-most Arizona has ever had in the Pac-12 Tournament.
- Deandre Ayton tied his season low with 25 minutes today and fouled out for the third time this season and the first since Jan. 20. Ayton tied Aaron Gordon, Angelo Chol and Ed Stokes for the third-most blocks in one game at the Pac-12 Tournament by an Arizona freshman with three.
- George King is now 18th all-time in Colorado history with 1,294 career points after scoring 19 points to lead the Buffs today. He also grabbed four rebounds and is 14th all-time with 681 career boards.
- Lucas Siewert scored 16 points off the bench for Colorado for his fifth-straight double-figure game.
- McKinley Wright IV was flirting with another triple-double before exiting the game due to an injury. In 22 minutes, he scored eight points, dished out five assists and grabbed four rebounds. The CU freshman had 20 points, 10 assists and eight boards in a first-round victory over Arizona State.
