



# POST-GAME NOTES

2019 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament  
Thursday, March 14 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena  
Final Score: #6 Oregon 66, #3 Utah 54

- With tonight's win, No. 6 Oregon will play No. 2 Arizona State tomorrow at 8:30 p.m. in the semifinals. Arizona State and Oregon split the season series, with each winning at home, while the Ducks hold a 3-0 record over the Sun Devils in the Pac-12 Tournament.
- Dana Altman, whose contract was extended earlier today through 2025-26, ties Sean Miller for the most all-time wins in the Conference tournament with 17.
- No one has won more Pac-12 Tournament games in Las Vegas than Oregon. The Ducks are 15-4 since the league moved the championship to the desert in 2013.
- Oregon improves to 30-16 in the Pac-12 Tournament and has won multiple games in the tournament for five straight years.
- Oregon makes it to the semifinals for the fifth consecutive year, the Pac-12's longest active streak.
- Utah falls to 6-8 all-time in the tournament and 0-5 against Oregon, having been eliminated by the Ducks in 2013, 2015, 2016, 2018 and 2019.
- For the second straight season, No. 6 Oregon upsets No. 3 Utah. It's the 52nd upset according to seed in 22 Pac-12 Tournaments (202 total games).
- Thursday's quarterfinals marks the first time since the event's 2015 first round that two upsets (according to seed) occurred on the same day.
- Oregon has won six-straight games heading into the semifinals, its longest streak of the season.
- During Oregon's six-game win streak, it has held all of its opponents to less than 62 points. The last time it did that was 1982-83 prior to the implementation of the shot clock.
- Dana Altman is now 160-19 when holding opponents under 70 points during his tenure at Oregon, 125-11 in the last six seasons.
- Oregon trailed, 24-18, at halftime and outscored Utah by 18 in the second half to notch the first come-from-behind victory in the 2019 Pac-12 Tournament.
- Utah suffered its first loss while leading at halftime this season (14-1).
- Francis Okoro tied the Pac-12 Tournament record with six blocked shots in a game, matching Stanford's Josh Huestis (2013) and Washington's Malik Dime (2017).
- Utah was held to season-lows in made three-pointers (2-23) and three-point percentage (8.7)
- Louis King scored 20 points on 7-of-17 shooting, two points shy of his career high. He has scored at least 10 points in 17-of-20 games against Pac-12 opponents this season.
- Timmy Allen scored 14 points for Utah and has scored double digits in seven straight games and 10 of the last 11.
- Sedrick Barefield finished with five points on 2-12 shooting, ending his 15-game streak of 10-or-more points.
- Sedrick Barefield connected on one 3-pointer which tied him for second on Utah's single-season three-point list (93).
- Donnie Tillman led Utah in scoring with 18 and has double-digit scoring games in his past five games after being inserted into the starting lineup six games ago.
- Payton Pritchard notched three steals in the quarterfinal matchup and is now third all-time on Oregon's career steals list (157).
