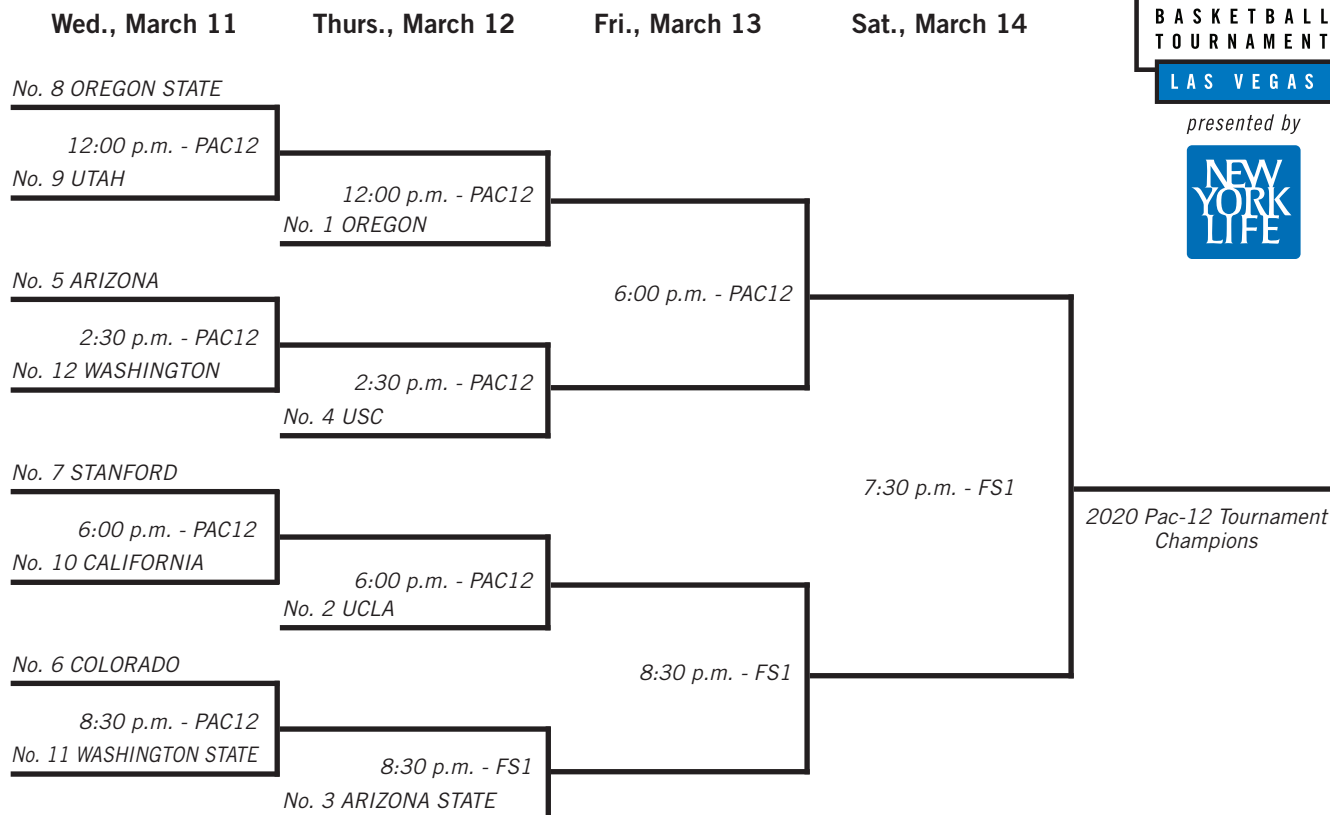

Post-game Interview Process:

Due to the ongoing Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation, the Pac-12 Conference has made a number of adjustments to its Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament taking place this week in Las Vegas, including post-game media availability. Media will not be permitted to enter team locker rooms or the locker room hallway, but will have access to interview student-athletes and the head coach as part of the post-game availability in the press conference room. This decision is made given the close quarters and personal nature of the locker room environment, and after consultation with our schools, and consideration of the current recommendations of health authorities and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

After each game, press conferences will begin after a cooling-off period not to exceed 10 minutes for the winning team and 15 minutes for the non-winning team. The cooling-off period begins when the coach enters the dressing room immediately following the game. The coach must proceed directly to the dressing room after the game unless requested to remain on the floor for a short interview by the organization that has purchased rights to televise the game. Coaches shall not make themselves available to selected media representatives (such as a reporter for the institution's radio network or a coach's show) prior to the conclusion of the cooling-off period. This format will flip for the Championship game as the winning team will participate in the post-game trophy presentation.

Post-game Press Conference:

The head coach and three or four selected players will attend the post-game press conference. The head coach and players from the winning team will appear first, following the 10-minute cooling-off period. The head coach and players from the non-winning team will follow after their team's 15-minute cooling-off period. This format will flip for the Championship game as the winning team will participate in the post-game trophy presentation.

Wireless Capabilities/Phone Lines:

Wireless internet access will be available in the T-Mobile Arena and in the media work room. Should you need to request your own hardware/T1/phone line at your seat location and/or in the media room, contact Jeff Thompson at T-Mobile Arena (jthompson@tmobilearena.com or 702-692-1435). As a reminder, each team's radio network rights holder will be provided with an ethernet line and an analog phone line.

Originating Radio Stations:

Four radio broadcast locations have been set up on the bench side of the court. Three seats will be provided to each team's radio rights holder for broadcast purposes, along with a pair of hardwire ethernet connections and an analog line. **Originating radio networks will not need to order phone lines.** Each radio position will be equipped with a stat monitor that will provide real time game statistics, as well as an audio feed from the Press Conference room for post-game media interviews. Radio positions may be moved on a game-by-game basis depending on team bench location. **Student radio stations approved for credentials will need to arrange for their own phone lines.** Phone line troubleshooting: 702-692-1430.

Live Radio Shows:

Radio networks that are planning to broadcast daily shows from location will need to make arrangements for securing a site outside of the arena and phone lines with the T-Mobile Arena. Contact Katharine Sherrer (702-201-6142) or Scott Ghertner (702-845-6440) to arrange for a location. Media Services:

- The Pac-12 is doing its part in pursuit of global environmental sustainability and has limited the printing of postseason notes, box scores, play-by-play and press conference transcripts. A pdf version of the previously mentioned materials will be emailed to each credentialed member of the media during the tournament.
- A media workroom and photo workroom, equipped with wireless internet, are located across from the press conference room.
- ASAP Fastscripts will provide transcripts of the post game press conferences.

Seat Assignments:

- Seat assignments in the media areas of the T-Mobile Arena will be made by the Media Director and may change from session to session.

Photo Policy:

- During games, still photographers may only work from designated end zone locations. Priority will be given to AP, USA Today, SI, Getty and those photographers who cover the participating teams on a regular basis.



- Photographers must wear a credential while working in the end zone areas.
- Two baseline monitors will be assigned (one on each baseline) to oversee and work with photographers throughout the tournament. Photographers must check in each day with the photo marshal (seated along baseline photo box).
- Photographers must remain off the playing court until the television broadcast has concluded.

Television/Video Policy:

- During games, live television coverage on the court will be limited to the originating entity only. All other television stations must take a feed of game action. A press bridge will be available in the media work room for distribution of the game feed.
- Mini-cam operators will have access to the arena floor until 45 minutes before the first game in each session. There will be no access for mini-cam operators to the arena floor area (including seating areas) during games for any purpose or between games of the same session. In between sessions, and if there are more than 45 minutes before the tip of the first game of the second session, mini-cam operators will have access to the floor when the originating broadcast entity has discontinued its live coverage of the game.
- Mini-cam operators may shoot the post game press conference in the media work room. In addition, a patch box will be available for distribution of the feed of the post game press conference.
- Suggested locations for exterior stand-ups or beauty shots are Toshiba Plaza (outside main entrance to T-Mobile Arena). For further assistance, contact Katharine Sherrer (702-210-6142) or Scott Ghertner (702-845-6440).

Game Feed/Press Conferences:

Game Feed [Pac-12 Networks games one (1) through seven (7) and game nine (9)]:

The credentials will NOT be game specific, so once you've requested access, you will be able to download highlights from all eight games. PAC-12 TOURNAMENT STRUCTURE-SEEDING AND TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

Seeding: The seedings and pairings shall be determined upon completion of regular season play on Saturday, March 5. The won-lost percentage record of the teams in regular season Conference play will determine tournament seedings. The team with the best won-lost percentage in Conference play will be seeded #1, the next best won-lost percentage in Conference play will be seeded #2, and so forth through all the seeds.

Tie-Breakers: Procedures for determining all tournament seeding will be:

Two-team tie

- Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season.
- Each team's record (won-lost percentage) vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record (won-lost percentage) against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- Won-lost percentage against all Division I opponents.
- Coin toss conducted by the Commissioner or designee.

Multiple-team tie

- Results (won-lost percentage) of collective head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams.
- If more than two teams are still tied, each of the tied team's record (won-lost percentage) vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings, eliminating tied teams with inferior records until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record (won-lost percentage) against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

After one team has an advantage and is seeded, all remaining teams in the multiple-team tie-breaker will repeat the multiple-team tie-breaking procedure.

When the multiple-team tie is reduced to two teams, the two-team tie-breaking procedures will be applied.

- Winning percentage against all Division I opponents.
- Coin toss conducted by the Commissioner or designee.



Pac-12 Hall of Honor to Induct 2019-20 Class

The 2020 Hall of Honor class will be the 19th since its creation in 2002, and the third to feature legendary figures from an array of sports after the Pac-12 expanded the field to be inclusive of the broad-based athletics success across the Conference of Champions. Each year a new inductee from each Pac-12 university is welcomed into the Hall of Honor. Formal induction will take place on Friday, March 13 during a ceremony prior to the semifinals of the 2020 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament, presented by New York Life. Following induction, the class will be honored during a special halftime ceremony of the day's first semifinal matchup at T-Mobile Arena.

From Olympic Gold Medalists and Super Bowl Champions to NBA and WNBA veterans to NCAA Champions and collegiate athletics trailblazers, the 2020 class features another star-studded list of inductees.

Among the many combined accolades of this year's inductee class includes:

- 20 NFL Pro Bowl selections
- 12 seasons in the NBA
- Numerous Olympians, Olympic gold medalists, NCAA championships, world records, All-American recognitions, Hall of Fame inductions, Super Bowl appearances and retired jersey numbers
- Conference Player of the Year recognitions
- Honda Sports Awards
- Rose Bowl appearances
- Senior leadership who played key roles in establishing women's athletics on campus
- The first woman ever to receive an athletic scholarship on campus

Sean Rooks, Arizona - A four-year letter winner at Arizona from 1989-92, the late Sean Rooks owned the key during his basketball career and made an immense impact on the sport. As team captain his senior year, he was named MVP, Pac-10 All-Conference and an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American. Rooks helped Arizona capture three Pac-10 titles over his four years, as well as two Pac-10 tournament championships. Following his time at Arizona, Rooks spent 12 years in the NBA with multiple organizations before moving his expertise into coaching, both in America and overseas.

Melissa Belote Ripley, Arizona State - One of the greatest American swimmers of all time, Belote Ripley shattered the Arizona State record books and left an unparalleled legacy for the Sun Devils. Bringing home three gold medals for the American swimming team in Munich 1972, she also set a new American record during those Olympic games in the 200-meter backstroke. While at Arizona State, she won six individual National Collegiate Swimming Championships, leading the university to two national championships. A four-year All-American, Belote Ripley also earned the esteemed Broderick Award in 1977 as the most outstanding women's collegiate swimmer in the country. She was later selected to the U.S. Swimming "Team of the Century" in 1999.

Don Bowden, California - Setting the national half-mile record while in high school, Bowden would later set an NCAA mark in the half mile in 1957 while at the University of California, Berkeley. Later that year, after completing an economics final earlier in the day, Bowden became the first American to break the four-minute mile mark. At only 20 years old, he was the youngest person in the world to accomplish the feat, a mark he held at Cal for another 50 years. After setting several other school records, he went on to make the U.S. Olympic team in 1956 and was later inducted into the Cal Athletics Hall of Fame in 1987 and the USA Track & Field Hall of Fame in 2008.

Bill Marolt, Colorado - An athlete, coach, athletics director and Aspen native, Marolt made his mark as a ski icon in the Colorado community. For Colorado, he is one of only six student-athletes to be a four-time NCAA individual champion. Following his graduation, he went on to provide his expertise in coaching the Buffs in 1969, leading them to seven straight national titles before turning to coach the U.S. ski team from 1979-84, earning three gold and three silver medals over that span (a U.S. record five in the '84 Olympics, including three gold). Later, Marolt went on to become CEO and president of the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association for a landmark 18 years. In addition to the Pac-12 Hall of Honor, he is also a member of the U.S. Ski Hall of Fame, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame and CU Athletics Hall of Fame.

Dan Fouts, Oregon - At Oregon, Fouts was the 1982 Associated Press Offensive Player of the Year, also collecting numerous other records for the university before going on to the NFL. With the Ducks, Fouts held career records with 5,995 passing yards and 5,871 total offensive yards. He still stands among the top 10 of nearly all Oregon career-passing categories. In Eugene, he also established 17 other school records, including the University's single-game passing record with 396 yards, a record that stood for 19 years. Fouts also orchestrated what is still the largest comeback in school history, closing a 19-point deficit in a 41-40 win over UCLA in 1970. Drafted by the Chargers in 1973, he went on to enjoy an illustrious career in the NFL, later being inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1993, as well as the Oregon Hall of Fame in 1992.

Joni Huntley, Oregon State - Throughout her legendary career, Huntley shattered records and athletic barriers. Attending high school nearby Oregon State at Sheridan High, she captured six state titles and set the women's American record for the high jump, becoming the first American woman to clear six feet. Huntley went on to letter at Oregon State in her first year and became AIAW National Champion and All-American in both the high and long jumps. Now 45 years later, she still holds the Oregon State record for the high jump. On the international scene, she earned a gold medal in the high jump during the 1975 Pan Am Games and brought home bronze in the same event later in 1983. She also placed in the 1976 Montreal Olympic games and earned a bronze in the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. Huntley was later named to the Pac-12 Conference All-Century Women's Track and Field team in 2016.



Jennifer Azzi, Stanford - A four-year team captain, two-time FIBA world champion and two-time WBCA All-American, Azzi is one of the most respected and accomplished icons in Stanford women's basketball history. On The Farm, she earned her degree in economics while leading the team to two Pac-10 titles and the first NCAA championship in school history as a senior in 1990. The best player in the country that season, she earned the Wade Trophy, Naismith Trophy, Honda-Broderick Award, USBWA National Player of the Year Award and was named the NCAA Final Four MVP. Following her time at Stanford, Azzi went on to earn a gold medal with the U.S. women's Olympic team and played professionally for a total of 13 years, including five in the WNBA. Following her playing days, Azzi turned to coaching, becoming the head coach of the University of San Francisco's women's basketball program for six seasons, leading the Dons to the 2016 WCC Tournament title. She is a member of several Halls of Fame, including the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame.

Jonathan Ogden, UCLA - A four-year starter for UCLA, Ogden was selected twice to the All-Pac-10 team and was a consensus All-American as a senior in 1995. He capped off his collegiate career by winning the Morris Trophy, the UPI Lineman of the Year Award and became UCLA's first Outland Trophy winner. Following his time with the Bruins, Ogden went on to dominate with the Baltimore Ravens in the NFL, helping the team capture a championship at Super Bowl XXXV in 2001. An 11-time Pro Bowl selection, Ogden received All-Pro honors six times throughout his career. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2013, the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006, the Ravens Ring of Honor in 2008 and the College Football Hall of Fame in 2012. Ogden was later chosen as #72 on the NFL Network's list of the 100 greatest players of all time and named to the NFL 100 All-Time Team in 2020. The Bruins retired his jersey, number 79, just the eighth player in UCLA football history to have his number retired.

Barbara Hedges, USC - An esteemed athletic administrator and NACDA Corbett Award winner, Hedges led the Trojans to dominate during her 18-year career at USC. Her oversight saw the Women of Troy capture 13 national titles before she became a senior associate athletics director for USC in 1989. Later leaving for the University of Washington to become the first woman to hold the role of athletics director of an NCAA school in a major conference, she also would also become the National Association of Collegiate Athletic Directors' first female president in 1996 and the first woman on the National Football Foundation's Board of Directors in 1998. In 2002, she returned to USC as co-chair of the athletic department's Heritage Initiative fundraising effort and later served as chair for the 2016 USC Athletic Hall of Fame ceremony.

Kathy Kreiner-Phillips, Utah - A six-time Canadian national champion, Olympic medalist and NCAA Champion, Kreiner-Phillips dominated in skiing for the University of Utah. Her competition at the Olympic level began at the age of 14, competing for the Canadian National Team in the 1972 Olympics. Despite being the youngest competitor that year, she placed 14th in the slalom event. Later at the 1976 Innsbruck Winter Olympics, she became the youngest gold medalist in skiing history by winning the giant slalom at age 18. In her third and final Olympics in 1980, she placed fifth in the downhill, the best Olympic finish in the event by a Canadian woman at that time. For the Utes, she helped Utah win the first men and women's combined national title in 1983, winning the giant slalom to become the school's first NCAA women's champion. She was also an All-American for Utah's second-straight title in 1984.

Lincoln Kennedy, Washington - Helping the Huskies to three-straight Rose Bowl appearances and a perfect 12-0 National Championship season in 1991, Kennedy was one of the most dominant linemen in Conference history. A two-time First Team All-Pac-10 selection and a Pac-10 Morris Trophy Winner for Top Offensive Lineman, he was the only unanimous First Team All-American selection in 1992 among Pac-10 athletes. He was also the top offensive tackle in the nation during his senior season. Later selected in the first round of the NFL Draft, Kennedy went on to enjoy a professional career by earning three Pro Bowl selections from 2000-02. Following his playing days, Kennedy now serves as an analyst on Fox Sports radio broadcasts and Pac-12 Networks, serving as a team broadcaster for the Oakland Raiders. Kennedy was inducted into the University of Washington Hall of Fame in 2004 and the College Football Hall of Fame in 2015.

Jeanne Eggart Helfer, Washington State - A double threat at Washington State, Eggart Helfer was one of the most ferocious scorers in Cougar basketball history while also setting the school javelin record as a sophomore. She was the first woman to receive an athletics scholarship at Washington State, netting a legendary 1,967 points during her four-year career, an all-time Cougar scoring record that stood for 38 years until the 2019-20 season. After graduating, she went on to coach the Mead High School Panthers in Spokane, Wash., leading the girl's basketball team to three state titles in the 1990's. She would also later coach at Mt. Spokane High School. Now a member of the Pac-12 Hall of Honor, Eggart Helfer is also a member of several other Halls of Fame, including the Washington State Athletic Hall of Fame.

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Sabrina Ionescu had 20 points, 12 assists and eight rebounds to lead No. 3 Oregon to an 89-56 victory over No. 7 Stanford in the Pac-12 Tournament title game on Sunday.

Ruthy Hebard added 24 points, while Minyon Moore had 21 for the Ducks, who finished the game hitting 31 of 55 (56.4%) from the floor. Oregon finished 10 for 19 (52.6%) from 3-point range.

The Ducks (31-2) will assuredly receive a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament and figure to move up in the AP Top 25 poll after No. 2 Baylor lost to Iowa State, 57-56, earlier Sunday.

The Ducks and Cardinal were playing for the tournament championship for a third consecutive year, and fourth time in five years. Stanford won last year's championship and Oregon won in 2018.

"We were here last year, and we knew what it was like to lose," said Ionescu, who was named the tournament's MVP. "This is one of the nets we wanted to cut down this year."

The Ducks shook off a sluggish first quarter and used a stifling defense to thwart most of Stanford's efforts, while fueling their offense at the other end.

Mandalay Bay Events Center felt like home for Ducks' three-game tournament run, which saw much of the announced 6,794 in attendance on Sunday clad in Oregon colors.

Stanford, in the Pac 12 championship for a 17th time, did its best to quiet the crowd early.

The Cardinal frustrated the high-powered Ducks while keeping Ionescu scoreless and took a 17-14 lead after the first quarter despite shooting 5 of 14 (35.7%) from the floor. Williams did most of the damage for Stanford, scoring 11 points on 3-of-5 shooting - all from 3-point range - plus a couple from the free-throw line.

Then the Ducks woke up. The nation's most efficient offense shot 8 of 12, including 4 of 6 from 3-point range, in the second quarter to outscore the Ducks 29-9.

The Pac-12 Conference has won 16 NCAA basketball titles, second-most of any conference behind only the ACC (17) . . . Oregon's Tall Firs won the first NCAA Championship in 1939. Stanford claimed the national title in 1942, followed by Utah in 1944 and California in 1959 . . . UCLA established a basketball dynasty that included 10 titles in 12 seasons and a winning streak of seven consecutive NCAA crowns . . . In 1997, Arizona became the sixth different Pac-12 institution to capture the NCAA basketball title.

PAC-12 IN THE NIT & CBI TOURNAMENTS

The Pac-12 has had considerable success in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT), as five current members have captured the NIT crown - Colorado (1940), Utah (1947), UCLA (1985), Stanford (1991, 2012, 2015) and California (1999). Colorado also finished second in 1938, as did Utah in 1974 and 2018. Meanwhile third-place finishes were turned in by Oregon in 1975 and 2004, Colorado in 1991 and 2011, Utah in 1992, Washington in 2012 and Washington State in 2011. The league now stands at 109-90 (.548) in America's original postseason tourney. The records of all Pac-12 members in the NIT:
