



## 2016 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT Post-Game Notes

GAME 11: #1 Oregon State (69), #3 UCLA (57)  
Sunday, March 6, 2016

Oregon State won the 2016 Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament and the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. It is the first Tournament championship for the Beavers, who were also a regular season conference co-champion.

Total attendance for the Tournament was 27,613, breaking the old record of 27,415 set in the inaugural Tournament in Eugene, Oregon (2002). The single session record was set in yesterday's semifinal round (6,543.)

Weisner is the first OSU player to be named the MOP.

Oregon State Notes:

- Ruth Hamblin set the Pac-12 career record for blocked shots with 405. Her 5 tonight are the most in a Tournament final. She also set the Tournament finals record for rebounds with 20.
- Hamlin set a career high for rebounds with 20. Her 23 points were a season high.
- Weisner scored in double-figures for the 27<sup>th</sup> time this season.
- Sydney Wiese reached double-digit points for the 17<sup>th</sup> time in 24 games. Her 5 3-pt field goals tied for the most in Tournament final.
- Hamblin's 3<sup>rd</sup> double-double of the Tournament made her only the fourth player in Tournament history to do so (Kristine Anigwe of Cal also did so in this Tournament.) She recorded only the fourth 20/20 double-double in Tournament history. She also added to her Tournament career record for blocked shots, finishing with 29.
- Devin Hunter had a season high 4 (tie) assists. She reached double-figure rebounds for the 4<sup>th</sup> time this season with a season high of 12, one off her career high.

UCLA: Jordan Canada had her 27<sup>th</sup> double-figure scoring game. Kari Korver has double-digit points for the first time in the Tournament.

OSU's 50 rebounds were the most in a Tournament final game.

OSU finished the first half on a 12-0 run, building the largest halftime lead in a Tournament final game. UCLA put together a 16-2 run in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter to cut OSU's lead to nine points.

OSU's starters scored all of its 69 points. Its bench scored 3 points in the Tournament (vs. Washington).
