TEAMS COMPETE FOR PAC-12 TOURNAMENT CROWN IN SEATTLE

• In what has been one of the most competitive seasons in Pac-12 women's basketball history, the 2015-16 campaign culminates with the Pac-12 Tournament in Seattle. The event is in its fourth year at KeyArena, drawing three of the top four attendances in the tournament's 14-year run. The winner of the Pac-12 Tournament will also secure a spot in the NCAA Tournament.

• In the final weekend of play, ARIZONA STATE and OREGON STATE claimed a share of the Conference regular-season title, the Beavers claiming the top seed in the Pac-12 Tournament for the second-straight year. ASU claimed its first title since the 2000-01 campaign. It is the second title for both programs, all time.

• Following an unprecedented and unpredictable season, the tournament trophy is up for grabs. Four teams are ranked in this week's national polls with ASU, OSU, STANFORD and UCLA all appearing in the top 15 of the *Associated Press* and *USA Today/WBCA Coaches* polls. Seven different Pac-12 teams earned a national ranking at some point during the season, with five teams earning spots for a Conference-best nine weeks this season. 2015-16 also featured 14 upsets of ranked teams, including two in the final weekend.

• Arizona State, Oregon State and UCLA were placed in the NCAA Selection Committee's top 10, which was released on Monday night. The Pac-12 is the only conference to have three teams in the ranking, the trio making appearances in all three announcements. Stanford was mentioned as one of two teams also in the discussion for the top 10 in the Feb. 29 release.

• The only conference with four teams in the NCAA RPI top 10, 10 of the 12 Pac-12 teams have an RPI in the top 100.

• The Pac-12 coaches voted Oregon State's Jamie Weisner the Pac-12 Player of the Year, making her the first player from OSU to earn the honor in 15 years. CALIFORNIA's Kristine Anigwe was voted the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, the first Golden Bear to win the award in 10 years. OSU's Ruth Hamblin repeated as the Conference's Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year, also earning the Conference's Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the sport of women's basketball. Arizona State head coach Charli Turner Thorne was voted the Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the second time in her career and the first time in 15 years.

• The Conference office announced the All-Pac-12, All-Freshman and All-Defensive teams on Monday. Among the 15 players voted to the all-conference team by the league's head coaches, OREGON's Jillian Alleyne, UCLA's Nirra Fields, WASHINGTON's Kelsey Plum and Oregon State's Sydney Weise are three-time honorees. Hamblin made her third-straight appearance on the all-defensive squad.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP

Credential pickup will be available for pickup at KeyArena (305 Harrison Street, Seattle, WA 98109) Wednesday, March 2 through Sunday, March 6, according to the following schedule:

PARKING:

Media parking is available on a limited basis across the street from the KeyArena loading dock entrance on Thomas Street. Please indicate if you will need parking when applying for credentials. Parking passes will be distributed on-site when you pick up your credential. We ask that you park first, pick up your credential, then return to your car with the parking pass. You may access the parking lot from Thomas Street or Warren Street.

TRANSPORTATION:

KeyArena is easily accessible via public transportation and is highly encouraged. The Seattle Center Monorail can whisk you to the arena from downtown in 2 minutes (www.seattlemonorail.com) and 15 Metro bus routes serve the Center from around the city (www.metro.kingcounty.gov). Taxi cab company phone numbers will be posted in the media work room as a courtesy but is at your expense.

IN-GAME LIVE STATS:

There are a limited number of stat monitors available and priority will be given to television and radio broadcasting the game. A link to real-time updates via the Stat Broadcast System will be provided on-site. The link is for media-use only and should not be shared with the general public. However, you are welcome to share the link with media who are unable to attend the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament. Team and individual player game stats, as well as a live play-by-play, will be updated as play is happening.

TEAM, TOURNAMENT AND POSTGAME STATISTICS:

Halftime and final box scores will be distributed for each game.

Printed copies of the full final book (final box score and play-by-play) will not be distributed. A complete play-by-play will be available via the Stat Broadcast system (link will be provided on-site). Once statistics are verified, box scores and play-by-plays will also be posted on the Conference's official website at <http://pac-12.com/content/womens-basketball-statistics> (click on 20015-16, then the box score link of the game desired) or at <http://pac-12.com/2014-pac-12-womens-basketball-tournament/statistics>. ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM MEDIA VOTING:

Media attending the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament are asked, and encouraged, to vote for the all-tournament team and the tournament's most outstanding player by the 4-minute mark of the second half of the championship game. This year's voting will take place electronically via the Stat Broadcast system. The voting link is available at the live stats link that will be provided on-site. The voting will open on Saturday, March 6.

WIRELESS CAPABILITIES/PHONE LINES:

KeyArena courtside press seating area, media work room and interview room will be equipped with a wireless network, free of charge, for members of the media. Media members wishing to install their own phone line at their press row seat location or in the media work room should call Tim Wass at CCPI (206/505-5493) and ask for information on Pac-12 Tournament phone line installation.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS:

Press row seat assignments at KeyArena will be made by the Media Director and may change from session to session. Due to limited space on press row, please check the seating assignments for each session.

A work area has been designated for photographers and videographers in the Media Work Room in the press conference area.

ORIGINATING RADIO STATIONS:

Four radio positions have been established at press row. Seating charts will be posted with seat assignments. Phone lines (1 ISDN/2 analog) have been installed. Originating radio stations will have access to these positions for their game only. Please check the seating chart for seat assignments.

PHOTO POLICY:

During games, still photographers may only work from designated areas on the court, behind each baseline. Photographers will not be allowed to shoot from press row. Photographers must wear a credential at all times while working in the baseline areas. Photographers will need to check in with the Photo Marshall on a daily basis. Handheld strobes and flashes are not permitted, nor are tripods or attachments to the basket standard.

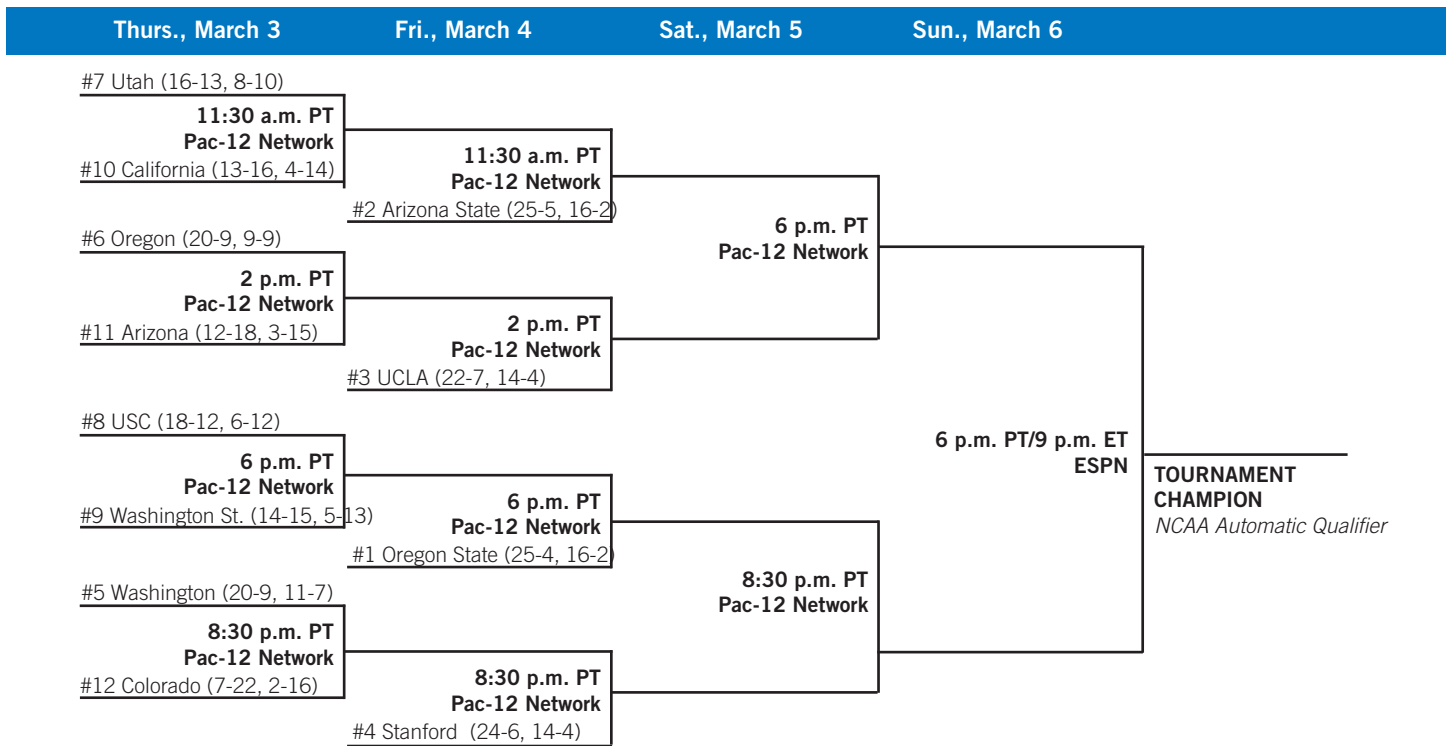
2016 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT
KEYARENA, SEATTLE, WASH. • THURSDAY-SUNDAY, MARCH 3-6

After three-consecutive years drawing near-record crowds, the 15th-annual Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament remains in Seattle in partnership with Force 10 Sports Marketing, LLC, the Seattle Sports Commission and Seattle Center. The tournament will be held at KeyArena from March 3-6, 2016 and will receive unprecedented national television coverage once again with each game of the tournament scheduled to be televised either on the Pac-12 Networks or ESPN.

The City of Seattle has embraced women's basketball and women's athletics. The WNBA's Seattle Storm loyal fan base has increased over the last several years. The majestic city provides convenient travel for teams and fans, with non-stop flights available from every Pac-12 city. In the three years the Pac-12 Tournament has been in the Emerald City, the four-day event has seen its biggest successes, recording three of the top four attendances in the 14-year history. The 2015 championship game was the second-most attended in the history of the event.

The Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament made its debut in 2002 and was held on the University of Oregon campus in Eugene, Ore. The Conference's premier women's sporting event then moved to HP Pavilion at San Jose for a six-year run (2003-08). It spent four years (2008-2012) in Los Angeles, with Galen Center playing host. The final two-year run of the event saw it combined with the men's tournament and the semifinal and championship games were played at the STAPLES Center.

The winner of the 12-team tournament receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. The tournament seeding and Conference Champion are determined by the 18-game regular-season Pac-12 schedule.



PAC-12 TOURNAMENT STRUCTURE-SEEDING & TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

1. Seeding and Tie Breakers

All Conference teams that are eligible for post-season play shall participate in the Tournament. The seeding and pairings shall be determined upon completion of the regular season. The won-lost percentage record of the teams in regular season Conference play will determine seeding. This shall apply even in the event one or more teams cannot play its entire 18-game Conference schedule. An ineligible team's record and place in the final standings will be utilized in any tiebreaker situations. The team with the best winning percentage in Conference play will be seeded No. 1, the next best winning percentage in Conference play will be seeded No. 2, and so forth.

2. Tie Breakers

Tie breaking procedures for determining all Tournament seeding will be:

Two-team tie

- a. Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season.
- b. Each team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular-season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- c. Won-lost percentage against all Division I opponents.
- d. Coin toss conducted by the Commissioner or designee.

Multiple-team tie

- a. Results of collective head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams.
- b. If more than two teams are still tied, each of the tied team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings, eliminating tied teams with inferior records until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

If at any point the multiple-team tie is reduced to two teams, the two-team tie-breaking procedures will be applied.

- c. Winning percentage against all Division I opponents.
- d. Coin toss conducted by the Commissioner or designee.

If a coin toss is needed to establish the final seeding and pairings, it will be administered by Commissioner Larry Scott. Each institution involved in the coin toss is entitled to have a representative present. PAC-12 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

SAN FRANCISCO - The Pac-12 Conference office announced today the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Players of the Week for the final week of the regular season. STANFORD's **Erica McCall** is voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week for the first time in her career, while CALIFORNIA's **Kristine Anigwe** is named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week for a Conference-record eighth time this season.

A junior out of Bakersfield, Calif., Erica McCall posted back-to-back 20-point games for the first time in her career. With Lili Thompson out against OSU, McCall lead the Cardinal to an upset of No. 7 Oregon State, 76-54, as well as a decisive 69-42 victory over Oregon to close out the regular season tied for third in the league standings. She was an impressive 3-for-5 from three-point range against the Beavers, after only attempting one three in 99 career games. Her 25 points in 26 minutes spurred the Stanford program to its 1,000th all-time victory, becoming only the seventh team in NCAA history to reach the milestone. McCall scored another 25 against the Ducks, also pulling down a career-high 18 boards and nabbing a career-high four steals. McCall averaged 25.0 points and 11.5 rebounds per game, shooting 56.1 percent from the floor. She also had four blocks over the two games giving her 60 for the season making her one of only four players in Stanford history to have as many in a single season. In the Cardinal's last five, McCall is averaging 20.6 points on 59 percent shooting, 9.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocks. McCall was also named the ESPNW National Player of the Week for her efforts. It is the first-career Conference weekly honor for McCall and the 105th all-time for Stanford.

Kristine Anigwe (Phoenix, Ariz.) wrapped up regular-season play by averaging nearly 20 points per game in California's final weekend against Oregon and No. 7 Oregon State. Anigwe shot 47.1 percent and racked up six offensive boards with 14 total rebounds on the weekend. She led the Bears in a 65-54 win over Oregon, then followed it up with a game-high 21-point performance against seventh-ranked Oregon State despite facing 2015 Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year Ruth Hamblin in the paint. With Anigwe's help, Cal nearly pulled off the upset against the Beavers, going so far as to tie the game with a jumper from the freshman to open the fourth quarter before OSU pulled away for a 54-44 win. Anigwe finishes the regular season with a double-figure scoring outing in 27 of her 28 appearances and 14 20-point games this season. The eight freshman of the week honors breaks the record set by current Washington junior Kelsey Plum, who was named the freshman of the week seven times in 2013-14. It is also the 11th all-time for the Golden Bear program, tying for the second most for any team.

A player of the week has been selected every week since 1986-87, the first year the Conference sponsored women's sports. A freshman of the week was first selected in 2012-13. The Pac-12 Player and Freshman of the Week are voted on by a panel of media that regularly cover Pac-12 women's basketball.

PAC-12 REGULAR SEASON CO-CHAMPIONS

In an intense final weekend of regular-season play with several upsets, OREGON STATE and ARIZONA STATE each claimed a share of the Pac-12 regular-season title. The Beavers reclaimed their title after winning the league last year, also grabbing the No. 1 seed in the Pac-12 Tournament by victory of tiebreaker. The Sun Devils claimed their first regular-season title since the 2000-01 campaign. This year's co-champions marks the sixth time in Pac-12 play where teams have shared the league crown.

PAC-12 TEAMS IN THE POLLS

Four Pac-12 teams are ranked this week in the *Associated Press* poll and in the *USA Today/WBCA Coaches* poll. OREGON STATE stands at No. 7 in both polls. It is the highest ranking of any Pac-12 team, followed by ARIZONA STATE, who comes in at No. 10 in the AP Poll and No. 11 in the coaches poll. STANFORD follows close behind at No. 11 and No. 12 in respective polls, while UCLA is No. 12 and No. 14, respectively. Five league teams were ranked in the AP poll from the week of Nov. 30 to the week of Jan. 11, it was the longest stretch of that many Pac-12 teams ranked in league history. Prior to that, five teams had been ranked in the AP on Nov. 13, 2006 for two weeks. Seven different Pac-12 teams earned a national ranking in one or both polls this season.

HAMBLIN EYEING BLOCKS RECORD

OREGON STATE senior **Ruth Hamblin** is threatening the all-time Pac-12 blocks record. The post, who is a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection, has been the Conference's blocks leader in each of the last two seasons, posting the Conference's best average this season, as well. Already owning the Pac-12's top-two blocking seasons, tallying a league-record 144 stuffs as a sophomore in 2013-14, she is on pace to becoming the only player in league history with three 100-block seasons, entering the tournament with 99 on the year.

ALLEYNE BECOMES ALL-TIME LEADING REBOUNDER

Senior forward **Jillian Alleyne** pulled down 15 boards to become the Pac-12's career rebounding leader on Jan. 17, 2016, surpassing the mark set by former Stanford great Chiney Ogumike. Alleyne is also ranked fourth all-time in NCAA history.

Alleyne's total numbers are impressive, but her career average is as well. Having averaged at least 11.9 rpg every season, her career average of 14.3 rpg shatters the all-time record set by former UCLA standout Natalie Williams who maintained a 12.8 rpg in her career from 1991-94. Alleyne also has 92 career double-doubles, breaking STANFORD's Chiney Ogumike's 85 for the most ever. Alleyne missed the first two games of her career in the final weekend, after suffering a season-ending injury in practice on Feb. 23.

2K CLUB

On Jan. 31, two Pac-12 standouts each reached 2,000 career points. WASHINGTON's **Kelsey Plum** needed only 88 games to reach 2,000 career points, becoming the fastest player to reach the milestone in Conference history. **Jillian Alleyne** also hit the mark, becoming the 10th player in the NCAA to total 2,000 career points and 1,500 career rebounds. Plum broke into the top-10 all time in Conference history, collecting 2,226 points to date.

NCAA SELECTION COMMITTEE TOP 10

The NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship Sport Committee made its third and final announcement on Feb. 29 of its top-10 rankings in seed order, giving a look into their current thought process as it relates to the NCAA Tournament selections in early March. Owing the No. 1 Conference RPI for most of the season, the Pac-12 again was the only league with three teams in the ranking as No. 6 OREGON STATE, No. 7 ARIZONA STATE and No. 10 UCLA made an appearance for the third time. Additionally, STANFORD received consideration.

PAC-12 IN THE NATIONAL STATS

As of Feb. 29, WASHINGTON's **Kelsey Plum** is averaging 26.5 points per game, the third-best average in the country. One of the most prolific scorers in

Pac-12 history, the junior became the fastest player to reach 2,000 career points in Pac-12 history.

Despite having a career-ending injury, OREGON senior **Jillian Alleyne** recorded double-doubles in the majority of the games she played in her career, including 23 this season which is second most in the country.

Also posting stats in the top-10 in the country are Oregon State's **Ruth Hamblin**, averaging 3.41 bpg which ranks eighth nationally and Stanford's **Karlie Samuelson** who ranks fifth nationally with a 45.3 three-point field goal percentage.

UPSET CITY

January was the month of upsets with 12 Pac-12 teams posting underdog wins, based on *Associated Press* rankings, further highlighting the strength of Pac-12 teams this season. QUICKLY AROUND THE LEAGUE

The Pac-12 concluded non-conference play with the top RPI in the nation. The Conference's 79.7 winning percentage in non-conference regular-season play is the top mark since the league sponsored the sport in 1986-87 ... Now in at the conclusion of regular-season play, the Conference owns the top RPI in the country at .5863, according to the NCAA index. Four Pac-12 teams have landed in the top 10, the most of any conference in the country ... Of the 17 players averaging double-doubles in the nation, the Pac-12 is the only league with three players achieving the feat including Alleyne, WASHINGTON's **Chantel Osahor** and UTAH's **Emily Potter** ... The Sun Devils tied its most-consecutive wins in program history at 15, winning games from 12/6-1/29 ... OREGON STATE is one of three teams in the nation with three 1,000+ active point scorers (Hamblin, Weisner, Wiese; Connecticut, Southern Illinois). The Beavers tied a program record with a 14-game win streak ... Senior center **Ruth Hamblin** had her hair cut on court in OSU's DAM Cancer event. Her hair will be donated to make wigs for cancer patients ... With road wins over Colorado/Utah, Washington/Washington State, Oregon has collected two road weekend sweeps this year. The last time the Ducks collected one road weekend sweep was in 2008-09 against the Washington schools. The Ducks are also averaging nearly 10.0 points per game more than last year, already posting more overall wins than all of last season ... WASHINGTON's **Kelsey Plum** was named a Nancy Lieberman Award finalist, given annually to the nation's top point guard. The junior is also on midseason watch lists for the John Wooden Award, Ann Meyers Drysdale USBWA National Player of the Year and the Dawn Staley Award ... Plum has 625 career made free throws, becoming the Pac-12 career leader which had stood since 1996 ... Also seeing vast improvements from last season is Utah. The Utes already have more overall wins and more Conference wins than all of last season. The Utes are under the direction of first-year head coach **Lynne Roberts**. Utah has also outrebounded its opponents in 18-of-25 games ... Washington State has played in 11 games this season in which the game was within two possessions in the final two minutes. WSU has a 5-6 record in those games ... ASU, OSU, UO and WSU all recorded double-digit winning streaks this season. STANFORD reached 1,000 wins as a program, becoming only the seventh school to achieve the feat with its 76-54 victory over Oregon State ... ARIZONA announced that it would part ways with head coach Niya Butts at the conclusion of the Pac-12 Tournament. Butts has spent the last eight years at the helm.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE FOR CAL'S GABBY GREEN

In the 106-44 win over Cal State Northridge on Dec. 30, California's **Gabby Green** posted the 22nd triple-double in Pac-12 history, recording 11 points, 10 rebounds and 14 assists. She becomes only the third Golden Bear to accomplish the feat in the Pac-12/10 era. She is also player in the Conference this season, and one of 18 players in the country to post a triple-double.

ANIGWE SETS CONFERENCE RECORD

CALIFORNIA's Kristine Anigwe earned Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honors for the eighth time this season, setting a league record previously held by current junior WASHINGTON's Kelsey Plum. The honor was first selected during the 2012-13 season.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS

With Pac-12 coaches hauling in some of the nation's top talents, the promise of potential are beginning to show and making an immediate impact. Two of the nation's top-scoring freshmen are in the Pac-12. CALIFORNIA's **Kristine Anigwe**, who has been named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week eight times this season, is the second-highest scoring freshman in the country, averaging 20.3 ppg, and ranks 30th among all players in the NCAA. WASHINGTON STATE's **Borislava Hristova** is the seventh-highest scoring freshman in the country with a 16.1 ppg average. Both players are also in the top-10 in the Pac-12 in scoring.

Also making an impact this season is OREGON's **Maite Cazorla**. Second in the Pac-12 in assists per game at 5.6 apg, she owns the highest assists average among freshmen in the country and ranks 26th among all players. No other freshman ranks in the top 25 in the category.

FORMER PAC-12 STARS FINALISTS FOR TEAM USA

USA Basketball announced its finalists for the USA Olympic Qualifying Tournament team. Three former Pac-12 stars were among the 30 finalists including ARIZONA STATE's Briann January and sisters Chiney and Nnemkadi Ogwumike of STANFORD.

HOT STARTS

Both USC and OREGON got off to strong starts this season, with the Ducks starting the season at 11-0 and the Trojans posting a 12-0 mark before registering their first loss. It was the Ducks' best start to a season since 1978-79. USC's best start dates back to when current head coach and Hall of Famer Cythina Cooper-Dyke was a sophomore on campus in 1982-83.

COACHING MILESTONES

ARIZONA's Niya Butts is the latest in the Pac-12 to reach a coaching milestone, picking up her 100th win on Jan. 17 at home against Colorado in her eighth year as a head coach. USC head coach Cynthia Cooper-Dyke picked up her 200th career victory on Jan. 4 against Oregon. On the same day, WASHINGTON STATE head coach June Daugherty, who has been a head coach for 27 years and has logged over 400-career wins, picked up her 100th on the WSU sideline against Colorado. She is the first coach in Conference history to win 100 games with multiple programs (Washington).

Several other coaches have reached significant milestones in just this season alone. ARIZONA STATE head coach Charli Turner Thorne won her 400th on Dec. 14 against Hartford, then reached her 200th career Pac-12 victory on Feb. 21 against Washington. She has been roaming the sidelines for 22 seasons, 19 of them in Tempe.

Both COLORADO coach Linda Lappe and OREGON coach Kelly Graves claimed milestone victories over the Thanksgiving break. Lappe, in her sixth season at her alma mater, picked up Division I-win No. 100 on Nov. 27 in a win over Massachusetts, while Graves, who is in his second season in Eugene but has logged 19 seasons on a Division I sideline, picked up his 400th the following day on Nov. 28. With the Beavers' victory over USC on Jan. 2, OREGON STATE head coach Scott Rueck picked up his 100th Division I win.

ALL-STAR RETURNS

Coming off a season where five Pac-12 teams earned NCAA Tournament bids for the second-straight season, the Conference looks to be as competitive as ever thanks, in part, to the return of eight of the 15 All-Pac-12 honorees from 2014-15. Defending regular-season Pac-12 Champion OREGON STATE has the most all-Conference honorees returning, welcoming back three, including the 2014-15 Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in SR C Ruth Hamblin.

NEW FACES & FAMILIAR FACES

The 2015-16 campaign welcomes a new face. New to the Conference is Utah's head coach Lynne Roberts. Roberts landed in Salt Lake City by way of the University of the Pacific. Last year she was named Co-West Coast Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Tigers to a 21-10 record.

Roberts joins an impressive cast of coaches across the 12 schools with a collective 146 years of experience. Leading the way is Hall of Fame head coach Tara Van Derveer, who will be on the Stanford sideline for her 30th season and 37 years for her career. ARIZONA STATE's Charli Turner Thorne also boasts more than 20 years of experience, entering her 22nd season as a head coach and 19th with the Sun Devils. WASHINGTON STATE head coach June Daugherty is logging her 27th season as a head coach, nine of which have been spent in Pullman. Just shy of 20 years of coaching is OREGON's Kelly Graves, who has been on the sidelines for 19 seasons, including two in Eugene.

ROAD TO INDIANAPOLIS

Teams across the country will be focused on getting to Indianapolis this season, the site of the 2016 NCAA Women's Final Four. To get to Indy, teams will have to go through regional site at Bridgeport, Conn., Dallas, Lexington and Sioux Falls, S.D. The first and second round of the tournament will take place on 16 campus sites with the top-16 seeds hosting.

PAC-12 ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS (COACHES VOTE)

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR - JAMIE WEISNER, OREGON STATE

Senior guard Jamie Weisner (Clarkston, Wash.) is the first OSU player to win the Conference's player of the year honor since Felicia Ragland was voted Pac-10 Player of the Year in 2001. It is the fourth citation for the program and Weisner is the third Beaver to earn the honor after Tanja Kostic won the award in 1995 and 1996. Weisner ranks fourth in the Pac-12 with a 17.0 points per game average, and her .478 shooting percentage is sixth and tops among Pac-12 guards. Her 87.7 percent shooting from the free throw line also ranks eighth in the country. Voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week on Feb. 22, she is the seventh player in OSU history to surpass 1,500 points and currently ranks in the top 50 in Pac-12 history in scoring, tallying over 1,600 career points. Her most impressive performances have come in Oregon State's biggest games of the year, tallying 12 of 18 points in a comeback win at Stanford, helping OSU snap a 29-game losing streak to the Cardinal. She also had 25 points against Arizona State and UCLA this season, as the Beavers also claimed a second-straight Pac-12 regular-season title, sharing it with the Sun Devils. Weisner is named to the All-Pac-12 team for the second-straight year, also earning honorable mention all-defensive team honors.

PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR - KRISTINE ANIGWE, CALIFORNIA

Kristine Anigwe (Phoenix, Calif.) is the first Golden Bear to win the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year award since Alexis Gray-Lawson won the award in 2006. Anigwe was voted the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week a Conference-record eight times, winning the recognition in seven of the first nine weeks of the season. Second in the Pac-12 in scoring with a 20.3 points per game average, she is the second-highest scoring freshman in the country and ranks in the top-30 among all players. In the Pac-12, she also ranks sixth in rebounding (8.9 rpg), second in field goal percentage (.563), sixth in free throw percentage (.741) and 10th in blocks (1.14 bpg). Her 11 doubles-doubles this season are also tied for fourth in the Conference. Nationally, she ranks 20th in the country in field goal shooting, and her 149 free throws made and 201 free throw attempts are the 14th- and 11th-most in Division I women's basketball this season. She is the 18th player in Conference history to be named All-Pac-12 as a freshman.

PAC-12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR & SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR - RUTH HAMBLIN, OREGON STATE

Senior center Ruth Hamblin is the first-ever Beaver to be voted the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in the nine-year history of the award, becoming the third player in Pac-12 history to earn the honor multiple times. She joins the ranks of former All-American Stanford's Chiney Ogwumike and WNBA and former Arizona State star Briann January. Now a two-time All-Pac-12 honoree, Hamblin is leading the Conference and ranks eighth in the country with 3.41 blocks per game. One of two players in Pac-12 history with multiple 100-block seasons, she is on the verge of becoming the only player in league history to record triple-digit block seasons three times, as she enters the Pac-12 Tournament with 99 stuffs on the year. The NCAA's active career leader in blocks, her presence in the paint has the Beavers limiting opponents to just 51.0 points per game on the season, the lowest opponent scoring average in the Conference and seventh in the nation. With Hamblin leading the way, OSU is also tied for first in the country with a 6.6 blocks per game average. A third team Associated Press All-American last year, she averages 11.4 ppg and 9.0 rpg, which ranks 20th and fifth in the Pac-12, respectively. Hamblin needs just eight blocks to tie the Conference's all-time record.

Off the court, Hamblin has been equally as impressive, posting a 3.85 grade point average while majoring in mechanical engineering. She is one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, also earning a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-District 8 team. Last year, she was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-American third team and recently helped to build and launch a rocket 21,750 feet into the air as part of a class project.

JOHN R. WOODEN PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR - KRISTINE ANIGWE, CALIFORNIA

In her 19th season at the Sun Devil helm, head coach Charli Turner Thorne earns the Pac-12 Coach of the Year honor after leading ASU to a share of the Pac-12 regular-season title and a top-10 national ranking for most of the season. It is the second time in her career she earns the award, the last time coming in 2001, the only other year the Sun Devils have won the regular-season Conference crown. ASU has won 16 Pac-12 games this season, tying a program record, and is 25-5 heading into the postseason. It is the team's third-straight 20-win season and fourth in five years. Turner Thorne is the second-winningest coach in Pac-12 history and has won over 400 games in her 22 seasons as a head coach. This season, an ASU-record three Sun Devils have been named to the All-Pac-12 team (Sophie Brunner, Elisha Davis and Katie Hempen) and Davis was one of five players named to the All-Defensive Team.
