POSTSEASON BEGINS FOR SEVEN PAC-12 TEAMS

• Six Pac-12 teams are headed to the NCAA Tournament, marking the sixth-consecutive year the Conference is sending at least five teams to the Big Dance, and one more is participating in the WNIT this week. OREGON, OREGON STATE and STANFORD each received a top-16 seed, earning the right to host a first- and second-round game.

• Pac-12 regular-season champion Oregon earned a No. 2 seed in the Portland Regional, equalling its best-ever seeding. League tournament champion Stanford is the No. 2 seed in the Chicago Regional and is making its 32nd-consecutive appearance and 33rd all-time. Oregon State is the No. 4 seed in the Albany Regional, extending its NCAA Tournament appearance streak to six-consecutive years, a program record.

• Joining the trio in the NCAA Tournament are No. 5-seed ARIZONA STATE, No. 8 seed CALIFORNIA and No. 6 seed UCLA, who will each hit the road for their postseason openers. ASU is also making a sixth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, Cal is making its seventh appearance in the last eight years and UCLA is in the tournament for the fourth year in a row.

• Rounding out the Pac-12's postseason teams is ARIZONA, who was invited to participate in the WNIT. The Wildcats host a postseason game for the first time since 2001, taking on Idaho State on Thursday.

• Pac-12 teams have seen plenty of postseason success in recent years, winning the most NCAA Tournament games (41) of any conference and posting the best winning percentage (.695) of any Power 5 conference over the last three years. Pac-12 teams have gone 17-1 in the first round during that span, placing at least four teams in the Sweet 16 for the third-consecutive year in 2018.

• For the first time ever, five teams appear in the *Associated Press* final poll. The writers' ranked the Cardinal and the Ducks at Nos. 6 and 7, respectively, extending the Conference's streak with two top-10 ranked teams in the final poll to five-consecutive years. The Beavs are No. 11 for their fifth-straight top-15 final AP ranking and ASU appears in the final poll for the first time since 2016. UCLA was ranked for the first time this season on Feb. 26 and ends at No. 20, the fourth-straight year the Bruins are in the final top 25. Five teams also appear in the *USA Today/WBCA* Coaches poll

• Seven from the Pac-12 were named finalists for the Naismith Starting 5, which was announced last week, with at least one from the Pac-12 listed at each position. It is the most combined finalists for any conference. The Nancy Lieberman Award (Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu, Oregon State's Destiny Slocum) and Katrina McClain Award (Oregon's Ruthy Hebard, Stanford's Alanna Smith) each had two Pac-12 finalists.

STANFORD WINS 13TH PAC-12 TOURNAMENT TITLE

LAS VEGAS (AP) -- Stanford got a measure of revenge en route to winning another Pac-12 Tournament title. Dijonai Carrington scored 22 points, and the seventh-ranked Cardinal erased some unpleasant recent history against No. 6 Oregon, beating the Ducks 64-57 on Sunday night.

For the Cardinal, it was its 13th championship of the 18 Pac-12 tournaments. Stanford lost to Oregon last season in the title game, and the Cardinal also were routed by 40 points a month ago by the Ducks - the worst defeat in Hall of Fame coach Tara VanDerveer's career.

"I think that was something that we had in our minds ever since we lost that game," said Stanford's Alanna Smith, who earned Most Outstanding Player honors for the tournament. "When you take a loss like that, you have no choice but to learn from it. We were happy we got to play Oregon today. We wanted another chance at them."

With the game tied at 51, Carrington made a layup, then stole the ball and drove the length of the court for another lay-in. After Ruthy Hebard made a free throw to get Oregon within 55-52, Kiana Williams hit a 3-pointer from the wing to give the Cardinal their biggest lead of the fourth quarter to that point.

Sabrina Ionescu, who led Oregon with 27 points and 12 rebounds, ended a four-minute field goal drought with a jumper with 1:14 left. She was the only Oregon player to hit a basket for the Ducks in the final eight minutes.

Stanford made all six of its free throws in the final minute to seal the victory. As the final seconds ticked off, the Cardinal players ran to half-court to celebrate.

"The competition we played day in and day out prepared us for today's game," VanDerveer said. "We won with our defense. We came in as the top-ranked defensive team in the Pac-12 and people locked in defensively."

Smith added 20 points and 14 rebounds for the Cardinal.

VanDerveer said after Stanford beat Washington in the semifinals on Saturday night that her team didn't play well offensively against the Ducks in the meeting last month and that they would "battle and play their game" this time.

Stanford (28-4) gave Oregon everything it could handle early on. The Cardinal built a 14-point lead early in the third quarter. It was the largest deficit the Ducks had faced this season. But then the offense went cold and the Ducks (29-4) scored 10 straight points at the start of an 18-3 run and took their first lead of the game on two free throws by Ionescu with 52 seconds left in the third quarter.

The teams traded the lead in the fourth before Carrington took over with 4:02 left.

Stanford got off to a quick start and led 33-24 at the half behind 14 points from Carrington and seven points and nine rebounds from Smith. Ionescu was only bright spot on offense for the Ducks as she had 13 points.

Stanford's Alanna Smith has been named the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, the Conference office announced today. The award, which is presented in each of the 24 sports the Pac-12 sponsors, was established to honor collegiate student-athletes that are standouts both academically and in their sports discipline.

Smith is a psychology major with a 3.47 cumulative GPA and is a two-time Pac-12 All-Academic honoree. Interested in early childhood development, Smith spent a quarter session at the Bing Nursery School on campus as part of her psychology class with a mission to promote the understanding of child development and improving lives of young children. A 2019 All-America candidate, Smith is involved in charitable causes throughout the community, including visits to the Lucile Packard Children's Hospital, St. Anthony's Padua Dining Room and involvement with Children's Champions. She also created Stanford's first Human Trafficking Awareness game on Jan. 20 against Washington State after taking a class on the issue last quarter.

The Melbourne, Australia native was named to several major award watch lists at the beginning of the season including the Naismith Trophy, Wade Trophy, John R. Wooden Award, Katrina McClain Award and Senior CLASS Award. She collected three Pac-12 Player of the Week awards this season (Dec. 17, Jan. 14, Feb. 18) and earned National Player of the Week recognition from ESPNW and USBWA for her performance on Dec. 17.

Smith is shooting 55.0 percent from the field, 48.1 percent from behind the arc and averaging a team-high 21.2 points per game enroute to becoming the 16th player in Cardinal history to record 1,500 career points. She has recorded nine double-doubles this season and is just 74 points shy of moving into 10th in school history among all-time scorers. Currently second in blocks (218), she looks to become the third player in program history to put together careers of 1,600 points, 150 made three-pointers and 200 blocks since the

PAC-12 ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS (COACHES VOTE)

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR - SABRINA IONESCU, OREGON

A junior from Walnut Creek, Calif., Ionescu repeats as Pac-12 Player of the Year after winning the honor last season. She is the first Duck to win the honor multiple times. Ionescu has put together another historic season recording a NCAA-record seven triple-doubles this season after already setting the all-time men's or women's NCAA career triple-doubles record earlier in the season. She enters the Pac-12 Tournament with 17 triple-doubles in 101 career games played. She ranks in the top 25 in the country in nine statistical categories this season, including ranking second in total assists (242), third in assists per game (8.1) and eighth in three-point percentage (.444). She also notched her 700th-career assist to become only the fifth player in the Pac-12 all-time to reach the threshold. She led the Ducks to a second-straight Pac-12 regular-season title and a second-consecutive No. 1 seed. She currently sits on every national player of the year watch list, including the Wade Trophy, Naismith Trophy and John R. Wooden Award, while also being a finalist for the Nancy Lieberman Award, presented to the nation's top point guard, an honor she won last season, and is a finalist for the Dawn Staley Award. She was also voted Pac-12 Player of the Week twice this season, USBWA National Player of the Week twice and ESPNW National Player of the Week once.

Last season, Ionescu became the third Duck to earn the Pac-12 Player of the Year honor all-time and first since 2000. It was the fourth time a player in Pac-12 history was named player of the year the year after being voted the Conference's freshman of the year.

PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR - DRE'UNA EDWARDS, UTAH

A freshman from Las Vegas, Dre'Una Edwards is the first student-athlete from Utah to win the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honor all-time. Before suffering a season-ending injury on Feb. 22, she was voted Pac-12 Freshman of the Week six times, helping the Utes claim nine weekly freshmen honors, setting a single-season Pac-12 record. She started in all 26 games she played in, averaging 11.6 points and 6.7 rebounds per game. She ranked fourth in the Pac-12, and first among rookies, in field goal percentage (54.0) and is sixth in the league in blocks per game (1.12). Edwards has helped Utah post its first 20-win campaign since 2012-13. Its nine Pac-12 wins are a team record, finishing a team-record tying sixth place in the final standings. She shot better than 50 percent from the floor in 17 games. In her first-career collegiate game at Nevada, she tallied 16 points and 15 rebounds, en route to seven double-doubles on the season.

PAC-12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR - KRISTINE ANIGWE, CAL

Senior Kristine Anigwe (Phoenix, Ariz.) is the first Golden Bear to be named Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in the 12-year history of the award. Anigwe is a four-time All-Pac-12 honoree, becoming the 15th player in league history to earn league honors four times, earning Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and USBWA National Freshman of the Year in 2016. She also makes a second appearance in three years on the All-Defensive team. Anigwe has been dominant in 2018-19, recording a double-double in each game this season, including a 30-point, 30-rebound performance on the final day of the regular season. She has a double-doubles streak of 30-consecutive games, dating back to last season. She ranks second in the Pac-12 in blocks per game (1.7), while recording career-bests with 23.1 points per game and a NCAA-best 16.4 rebounds per game. She is three blocks from becoming the 13th player in Pac-12 history to record 200 blocks. She is the fourth player in Pac-12 history to record 2,500 points (2,519) and ranks third all-time in rebounding (1,347), making her only the second player in league history to rank in the top five of both categories. Anigwe is on all the national player of the year watch lists, including the Wade Trophy, Naismith Trophy and John R. Wooden Award. She is also a finalist for the Lisa Leslie Award, presented to the nation's top center. She was voted Pac-12 Player of the Week five times this season, selected ESPNW National Player of the Week twice and was most recently tabbed USBWA National Player of the Week for her 30-30 outing on Sunday.

PAC-12 SIXTH PLAYER OF THE YEAR - ALEAH GOODMAN, OREGON STATE

Aleah Goodman (Milwaukie, Ore.) is the first-ever recipient of the Pac-12 Sixth Player of the Year honor. The sophomore guard is averaging 10.7 points per game coming off the OSU bench, while shooting 42.3 percent from the floor and 42.3 percent from long range in 24.9 minutes of playing time. She has been even better in league games, contributing 11.9 ppg to rank among the top 25 in the Pac-12 in the category, while also averaging 28.2 minutes per game. She was a key contributor in the upset win of Oregon where she had 22 points and also caused a key turnover in the final seconds to seal a 67-62 OSU victory. Since Feb. 1, she has played at least 24 minutes per game and averaged 12.0 ppg. The ESPNW National Player of the Week on Feb. 25, she has helped the Beavs, who have not finished lower than third since 2013, to a 14-4 Pac-12 record, a No. 3 seed and a first-round bye in the upcoming Pac-12 Tournament. Oregon State is projected to be a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament later this month.

JOHN R. WOODEN PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR - KELLY GRAVES, OREGON

In his fifth season at the Oregon helm, Kelly Graves earns the John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year award for the first time. It is only the third time since the Conference began sponsoring women's basketball in 1986-87 that a Duck mentor has received the award. The only other UO coach to receive the league's top coaching honor was Jody Runge when she was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 1994 and 1999. Graves has led the Ducks to a second-straight Pac-12 regular-season title, the program's fourth all-time and the first time the team has clinched back-to-back crowns since 1999 and 2000. The No. 1 seed in the upcoming Pac-12 Tournament, the Ducks lead the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.93), three-point field goal percentage (.427) and turnovers per game (10.0), while boasting the second-highest scoring offensive in the country (87.3 ppg). On Feb. 18, the program received its highest ranking in team history, coming in at No. 2 in the country in the Associated Press poll, appearing in the top six all season. Projected to be a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament later this month, Oregon is 27-3 on the season, posting its fourth-consecutive 20-win campaign.

CONFERENCE NOTEBOOK

STANFORD WINS 13TH PAC-12 TOURNAMENT CROWN

Stanford won its 13th Pac-12 Tournament title. The No. 2 seed in the event, the Cardinal defeated top-seeded Oregon, 64-57, in Las Vegas. The Cardinal has claimed a top-four seed in all 18 years of the Pac-12 Tournament. It was led by senior forward Alanna Smith who was tabbed the Most Outstanding Player after averaging 18.7 points and 15.0 rebounds per game. Stanford limited its opponents to a tournament-best 57.3 ppg and .337 shooting.

OREGON WINS SECOND-STRAIGHT PAC-12 REGULAR-SEASON TITLE

Oregon claimed its second-straight Pac-12 regular-season crown and fourth all-time, going 16-2 in league play, tying a program record set last year for most Conference victories. It is the first time since 1999 and 2000 the Ducks won back-to-back league crowns.

PAC-12 IN THE POLLS

For the first time ever, the Pac-12 had five teams ranked in the final *Associated Press* poll, which was announced March 18. Stanford and Oregon end the season in the poll ranked No. 6 and No. 7, respectively, while Oregon State is No. 11 and Arizona State is No. 22. UCLA, which has been on a tear the last two months, has only been ranked since Feb. 26 and ends the season at No. 20 in the AP.

At least four Pac-12 teams were ranked in the *Associated Press* and *USA Today/WBCA* Coaches polls and as many as six have appeared in a poll this season. Three league teams earned top-10 rankings in the preseason polls, a first in the league's history. On Dec. 17, six Pac-12 teams were ranked in the *USA Today/WBCA* Coaches poll for just the third time in league history and second time in two years. The last time six teams were in the national coaches poll was the preseason ranking released prior to the 2017-18 and 2006-07 campaigns. Five teams are also ranked in the coaches poll heading into the NCAA Tournament.

PAC-12 IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Pac-12 received six NCAA Tournament bids this season, one less of the league record of seven set in 2017 and also marking the sixth-straight year the Pac-12 has received at least five NCAA Tournament bids.

Pac-12 teams have seen plenty of postseason success in recent years, winning the most NCAA Tournament games (41) of any conference over the last three years and posting the best winning percentage (.695) of any Power 5 conference during that span. Pac-12 teams have gone 17-1 in the first round the last three tournaments, placing at least four teams in the Sweet 16 for the third-consecutive year in 2018. At least two teams have advanced to the Elite 8 the last three years (including three in 2018 and 2016), and there has been at least one Pac-12 team in the Final Four in nine of the last 11 years, including a league-record two in 2016 (Oregon State and Washington).

The Conference advanced a league-record five teams to the Sweet 16, sending at least four in each of the last three seasons.

Four different Conference teams have advanced to the NCAA Women's Final Four since 2013 and nine different Pac-12 teams have appeared in the NCAA Tournament during that span with 11 earning berths since 2000.

FINALISTS FOR NATIONAL WATCH LISTS ANNOUNCED

Seven Pac-12 women's basketball players are among the finalists for the Naismith Starting 5, which the WBCA and Basketball Hall of Fame announced last week. Five finalists were announced for each of the five positional awards and at least one from the Pac-12 was on each of the lists. The seven combined finalists are the most for any conference in the country. Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu is a finalist for the Nancy Lieberman Award, looking to become a repeat winner. Teammate Ruthy Hebard is a finalist for the Katrina McClain Award, also a winner of the honor last year. California, Oregon, Oregon State and Stanford were all represented among the finalists. The Pac-12 lead all conferences with three of the 10 semifinalists for the 2019 Women's Citizen Naismith Trophy. California's Kristine Anigwe, Ionescu and Stanford's Alanna Smith were among those named for the national player of the year honor.

ARIZONA, UTAH ENJOYING SEASON SUCCESS

Arizona and Utah have been enjoying historic season in their own right. The Utes go into the Pac-12 Tournament as the No. 6 seed after being picked to finish eighth in the preseason by the league's coaches, setting a program record for most Pac-12 wins since joining the league in 2011-12 (9). Utah got off to an 18-1 start and jumped into the *Associated Press* top 25 for the first time in 11 years in late January, moving up to as high as No. 14.

Arizona claims its best seeding since 2010, entering the tournament as the No. 8 seed, better than the 10th seed they were projected to be. The seven conference wins is also the most for UA since 2010-11, posting its first winning record since that season. The Wildcats head to the postseason for the first time since 2011, heading to the WNIT.

IONESCU UNDISPUTED TRIPLE-DOUBLE RECORD HOLDER

Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu recorded her seventh triple-double of the season on Feb. 24, setting a new single-season NCAA record. She already owns the NCAA career mark with 17, more than any man or woman in NCAA history.

During the week of Dec. 17, 2018, Ionescu had back-to-back triple-doubles to set the NCAA men's and women's career record held by Kyle Collinsworth of BYU. She was already the NCAA's women's record holder heading into the season, wasting no time adding to her total by logging her first triple-double in the season opener at Alaska Fairbanks.

PAC-12 SCORING IS UP

As a collective group as of March 18, the Pac-12 is tied for the best scoring average among all conferences at 71.0 points per game. League teams also have the best collective shooting percentage (.4375) and 3-point shooting percentage in the country (.3436), and third-best free throw percentage (.7165).

Compared to 2017-18, the Conference's numbers are up in each of those categories, recording 2.0 ppg better than a year ago when it average 69.00 ppg for seventh-best among the leagues. In 2017-18, Pac-12 teams were shooting 42.95 pct. (3rd), 33.77 pct. from long range (4th) and has a slight improvement from last season's 71.16 free throw shooting (9th).

ANIGWE MAKING THE MOST OF HER FINAL COLLEGIATE SEASON

California's Kristine Anigwe has been having a season not often witnessed. When she eclipsed the 1,000-career rebound mark, she became just the 11th player in Pac-12/10 history to collect 2,000 points and grab 1,000 boards. The All-American also became the 23rd player in league history to grab 1,000 boards and was only the 20th player to score 2,000-career points.

Anigwe is just the second player in league history to rank in the top five in both scoring and rebounding, joining former Stanford All-American and WNBA Rookie of the Year Chiney Ogwumike. She has reached the 2,500-point threshold as well, a threshold only three other players have reached in league history. She has posted a double-double in every game this season, recording 32 in a row (dating back to last season, 31 of which were in 2018-19). In her final regular-season game, she recorded just the second 30-point, 30-rebound game, becoming the first player since 2002 to have a 30-30 game. Her 30 boards tied a Pac-12 record, accounting for seven of the league's top rebounding outings this season.

Anigwe is only the second player in NCAA Division I to average 20.0 ppg and 16.0 rpg, dating back to 1999-2000. The other being Jillian Alleyne of Oregon (21.4 ppg, 16.2 rpg). She is on track to become the first player in 30 years to average at least 22 points per game and 16 rebounds per game in the same season, and would be just the third woman to ever do so in Division I women's basketball history.

NCAA STATISTICAL LEADERS

California's Kristine Anigwe is putting together a dominating senior campaign as one of the top players in the country. Posting a double-double in each of her team's games so far, she is the national leader in the category (31, as of March 18) and is the rebounding leader as well (16.4 rpg), while ranking seventh in scoring (22.9 ppg).

Tallying 17-career triple-doubles, Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu leads four Pac-12 distributors among the top 25, ranking third overall with an 8.1 apg. Utah's Dru Gylten who ranks 25th in the country but is the best among the nation's freshmen in the category (5.5 apg). Five from the Pac-12 are also among the top 17 in assist-to-turnover ratio with Arizona State's Reili Richardson ranking fifth with a 3.60 ATO and UO's Maite Cazorla is eighth at 3.29 ATO.

The Ducks' Ruthy Hebard has the second-best shooting accuracy in the nation with an amazing 68.2 percent. Three Ducks rank in the top-20 in three-point shooting, Erin Boley coming in fifth (.453).

The Pac-12 also boasts five of the nation's most prolific scorers, ranking among the top 32. Arizona's Ari McDonald is third with a 25.0 scoring average.

With Ionescu and Hebard leading the way, Oregon is third in the nation in scoring (86.1 ppg), and leads the country in three-point field goal percentage (42.0), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.91) and turnovers per game (10.0).

GOING THE DISTANCE

The 3OT game between Arizona and UCLA on Jan. 27 was the first in league history since 2001 when Washington and USC needed the three extra periods to decide a game in Seattle. The Huskies won that contest, 91-79. The only other 3OT game since 2001 involving a Pac-12 team was in 2008 when UA went the distance against Loyola Marymount, winning the road contest, 93-88.

VANDERVEER REACHES ANOTHER MILESTONE

Stanford head coach Tara VanDerveer captured her 900th victory on the Farm becoming just the fifth DI coach, men's or women's, with that many at a single school. She joins Pat Summitt (Tennessee), Geno Auriemma (Connecticut), Mike Krzyzewski (Duke) and Jim Boheim (Syracuse). Nearly two years ago on Feb. 3, 2017, she became just the second women's coach to reach 1,000 career wins.

MORE COACHING MILESTONES

Oregon State head coach Scott Rueck became the seventh coach in Pac-12 history to reach 200 wins at a Pac-12 institution. Stanford's Tara VanDerveer and ASU's Charli Turner Thorne are Nos. 1 and 2 on the all-time wins list in league history. Rueck also just won his 100th league game, making him the eighth all-time to reach the threshold.

Oregon head coach Kelly Graves closed out the regular season hitting the 500 Division I win mark. That puts him among the top 35 active DI winningest coaches.

PAC-12 FAN SUPPORT

Nearly 22,000 fans went to two games in Oregon and Oregon State over four days from Feb. 15-18 when the rivals battled in a home-and-home series. Both the Ducks' and Beavers' fan base has seen a dramatic increase from last season, with UO averaging nearly 3,000 more in attendance compared to last season. OSU has also seen an increase in attendance from last season, as have five additional programs: Arizona, Arizona State, California, Stanford and Utah.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

With the non-conference regular-season slate wrapped up, the Pac-12 posted a 109-27 record an .801 winning percentage, the best win percentage of all conferences. It marks the fourth time in six years that Pac-12 teams have won over 100 non-conference regular-season games and the third time in three years teams have posted a collective winning percentage of over .800.

SISTER ACTS

Washington State's three Molina sisters - Channele, Celena, and Cherilyn are the only trio of active sisters in the Power 5 conferences. Other sister acts in the Pac-12 include the USC's Moore duo - Minyon and Mariya. The Trojans' Desiree Caldwell older sister Reece is a member of the California Golden Bears and is pursuing

CONFERENCE NOTEBOOK

a master's degree in public health. The Sabally sisters wear the same colored jersey in Eugene. Older sister Satou was the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year last season but freshman Nyara will sit out this season because of an injury.

PRESEASON RANKINGS

For the third-straight year and just the fourth time ever, the Pac-12 had five teams ranked in the preseason *Associated Press* poll, including three in the top 10 for the first time ever. It was the most of any league in the country in the top 10.

Also for the first time ever, the Pac-12 had three teams in the top 10 of the WBCA Coaches poll and four total teams ranked. For a week-by-week listing of team rankings, go to page 2.

HISTORIC CAMPAIGNS

Pac-12 women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful run, coming off a fifth-straight season with at least five NCAA Tournament bids. Since 2015-16, the Conference boasts the most NCAA Tournament wins (41) of any league and the best winning percentage among peer conferences (.695), posting double-digit NCAA Tournament victories in each of the last three seasons. The Pac-12 is the only conference to have at least two teams in the Elite Eight the last three years, placing at least four in the Sweet 16 during that time. Four Pac-12 teams appeared in the final *Associated Press* poll, the fourth-straight year the Conference had at least that many teams in the final ranking.

ALL-STAR RETURNS

Ten of the 15 All-Pac-12 honorees returned this season, including national award winners at their respective positions Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu (Nancy Lieberman Award winner) and Ruthy Hebard (Katrina McClain Award winner). Cal's Kristine Anigwe was a three-time All-Pac-12 honoree, with Colorado's Kennedy Leonard also earning a spot on the team the last two seasons. Also returning are UO's Maite Cazorla, Washington State's Borislava Hristova, Utah's Megan Huff, Arizona State's Kianna Ibis, Washington's Amber Melgoza and Stanford's Alanna Smith.

In addition, three former national freshmen of the year dot the Pac-12 rosters. Anigwe and Ionescu both were honored with the award by the USBWA in 2016 and 2017, respectively. Redshirt sophomore Destiny Slocum was bestowed the honor by the WBCA in 2017 before transferring to Oregon State.

NEW FACES & FAMILIAR FACES

The Pac-12 welcomes a new face to the sidelines as Kamie Ethridge takes over the Washington State bench. Ethridge is one of the legendary figures in women's basketball, earning a place in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. Prior to arriving in Pullman, she spent four seasons at Northern Colorado, leading the team to the NCAA Tournament.

The other 11 coaches return for 2018-19, including Hall of Fame head coach Tara VanDerveer who is in her 33rd season at Stanford and is serving her 40th season as a head coach over three stops. The second-most tenured head coach in the Pac-12 is Arizona State's Charli Turner Thorne who is in her 22nd season with the Sun Devils. She is a graduate of Stanford where she was a guard for VanDerveer for three years. The other Pac-12 head coaches have been at their respective institutions for single-digit seasons. Oregon State's Scott Rueck is one shy of the 10-year mark.

ROAD TO TAMPA

Teams across the country will be focused on getting to Tampa this season, the site of the 2019 NCAA Women's Final Four on April 5 and 7. To get to Tampa, Fla., teams will have to go through regional sites in Albany, N.Y., Chicago, Greensboro, N.C., and Portland, Ore., where the Oregon State Beavers are hosts. Regional play takes place from March 29-April 1, with specific dates to be announced. The first and second round of the tournament will take place on 16 campus sites with the top-16 seeds hosting, March 22-25, 2019. The top 64 teams will learn their fates in the broadcast of the annual selection show on Monday, March 18, 2019.

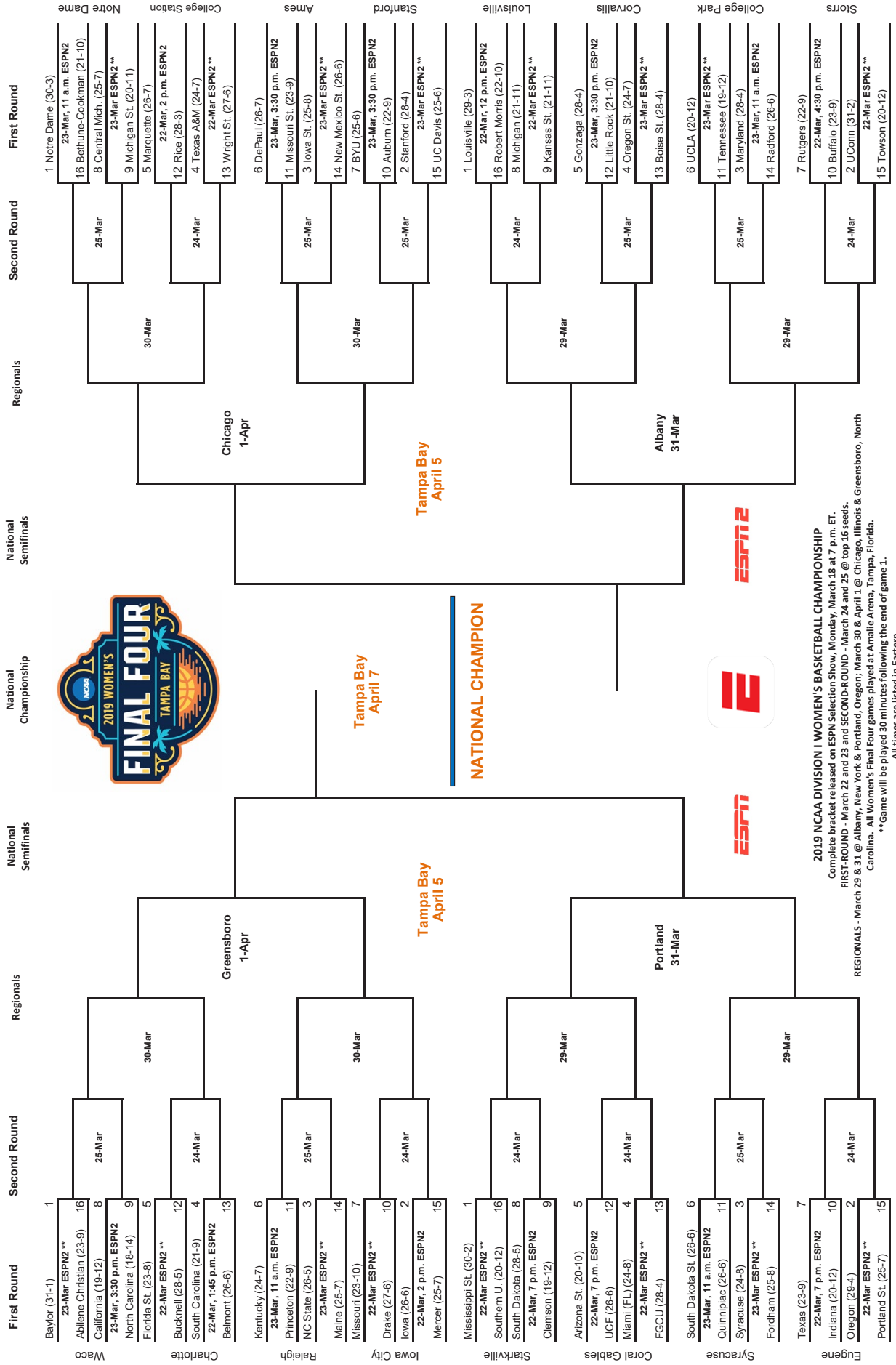

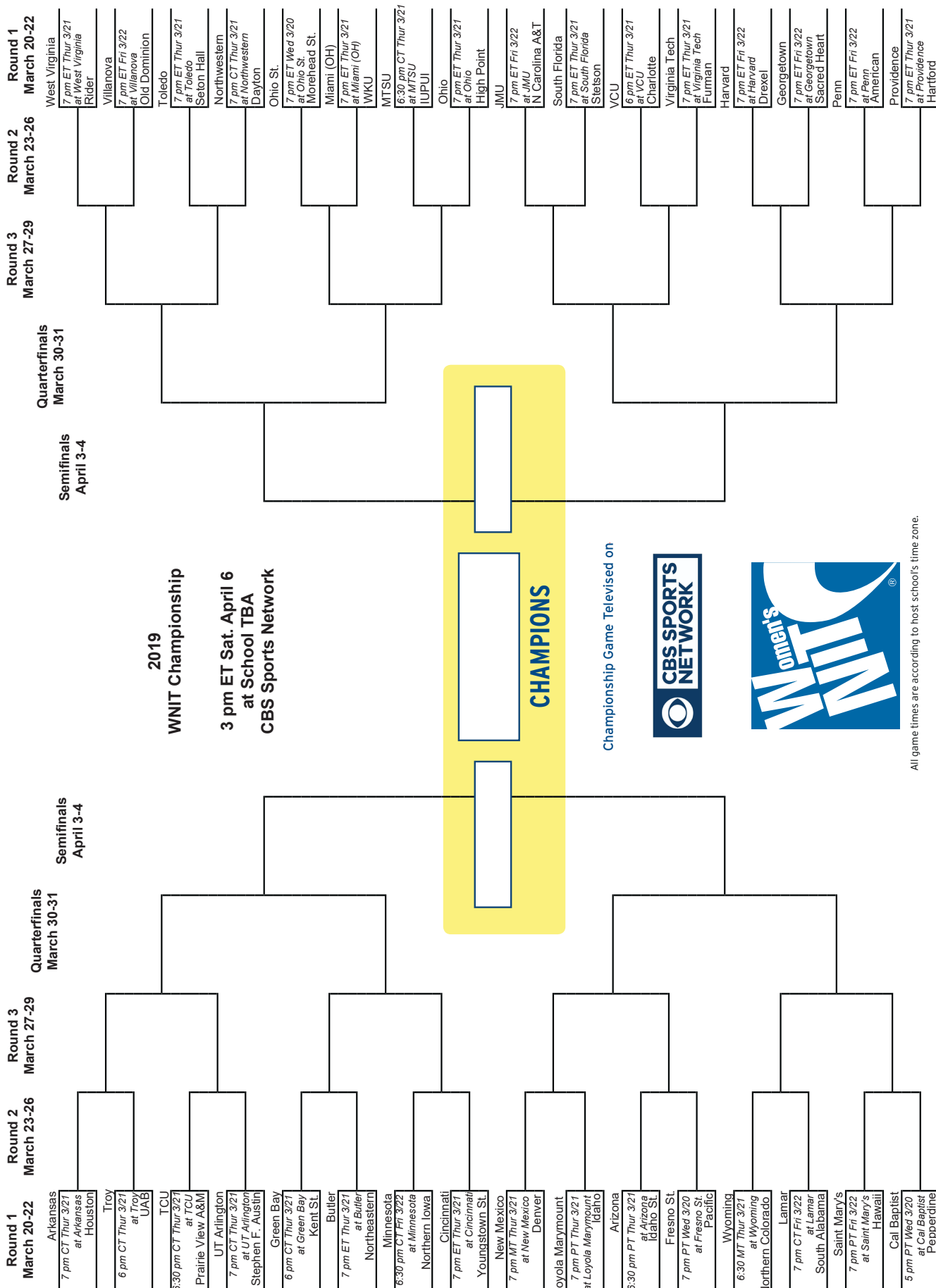
