



2015 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

Post-Game Notes

GAME 1: #7 Washington State (66), #10 Oregon (64)
Thursday, March 5, 2015

Washington State advances to play #2 seeded Arizona State on Friday at 11:30 a.m. PST.

This game was a repeat of last season's first round matchup between #7 WSU and #10 Oregon, with WSU again prevailing. Last season's game was the highest scoring in Tournament history (107-100).

After losing its first 10 Tournament games in as many years, WSU has now won 6 of its last 9. The Ducks have lost 8 in a row since a 2008 win over the Cougars (66-45).

The Cougars improve their overall Tournament record to 2-2 vs. Oregon and 6-13 overall. Oregon falls to 4-14 in Tournament play.

Jillian Allyene, Oregon, made the first 3 point field goal of her career with 10:15 to go in the first half. She missed three attempts last season and one (Santa Clara) this season.

7 Duck turnovers led to 11 of the Cougars' first 13 points of the game.

WSU led 15-14 when Oregon went on a 12-2 run between 11:01 and 7:29 of the 1st half (Ore 26, WSU 17). The Ducks again had a 9 point lead (28-19) at 7:05 when WSU went on an 11-1 run to take a 30-29 lead (2:31). Oregon responded with a 9-0 run before Louise Brown made a 3 point FG at the buzzer for the Cougars (38-33, Oregon lead at the half.) Oregon's bench outscored WSU's 14-0 in the first half.

Oregon shot .540 (27-50) from the field. It was its best shooting game since its season opener (Utah State, .548, 34-62) and best against a conference foe this season (.491, twice)

WSU's Lia Galdeira wore #23 to honor injured teammate Shalie Dheensaw. Galdeira is one of three 2014 all-Tournament players to return this season; she set the all-time single Tournament record with 75 points last season.

Galdeira scored a career-high 34 points (33, twice, last vs. Maryland, 11/29/14). Her 34 was over half of WSU's game total.

Galdeira scored her 22nd point of the game with 16:47 to go in the game (more than half of WSU's 41 points at that time). It was her 17th 20+ scoring game of the season (33rd career). She added to her conference lead in steals with 2, giving her 96 on the season.

Allyene notched her 28th double-double of the season (69th career).

7 Duck turnovers led to 11 of the Cougars' first 13 points of the game.
