



2015 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

Post-Game Notes

GAME 2: #6 UCLA (80), #11 Arizona (62)
Thursday, March 5, 2015

UCLA advances to meet #3 Stanford on Friday at 2:00 p.m. It will be the 10th Tournament meeting between the two schools (14 seasons), the most in Tournament history. Stanford has an 8-1 edge in the series but the one UCLA win was in the 2006 championship game.

UCLA and Arizona have only met once before in the Tournament's 14 season run (2012: #12 Arizona 61, #5 UCLA 57). It was the 74th meeting overall between the two team. UCLA now leads the series 53-21.

UCLA is now 15-12 in Tournament games and is second only to Stanford in Tournament wins.

Bruin Kori Korver picked up her 2nd foul after just 1:40 of play and sat on the bench until 7:10 remained in the half. The Bruins outscored the Wildcats by 14 points during the 21 minutes she played today.

UCLA had a three-point lead (23-20) before finishing the first half on a 14-4 run.

34 of UCLA's 80 points came from its bench; the Bruins had a 34-20 advantage in that category over Arizona.

UCLA's leading scorer on the season, Nirra Fields, scored in double figures for the 25th time this season (66th career). It was also the 8th time this season that she scored 20+ points (career 23). Her 21 points led the Bruins in scoring for the 17th time this season (35th career). 17 of those points came in the 2nd half.

UCLA shot 63% from the field in the 2nd half (27-37), paced by Fields' 8 of 10 shooting.

Wildcat Candice Warthen completed her Arizona career with 1128 points, number 16 on the all-time Arizona scoring list.

Bruin Monique Billings scored in double figures for the 5th time this season.

UCLA's Jordin Canada equaled her career high for assists (9) and just missed her second double-double (10 points).
