CHAMPIONSHIPS PREVIEW

Sewailo Golf Club in Tucson, Arizona will be the site of the 2017 Pac-12 Women's Golf Championships on April 24-26, 2017, and will feature some of the top collegiate golf teams and individuals in the country.

ARIZONA STATE has put together an amazing season as the Sun Devils are ranked No. 2 in the nation going into the Pac-12 Championship. Sophomore **Linnea Strom** placed first in the 2016 Pac-12 Women's Golf Championship. She recorded two second-place finishes in the Darius Rucker Invitational and the Clover Cup during the 2017 season. The ASU Women's golf team recently won the PING/ASU Invitational by 20 strokes, their first home tournament win since 2007. This marked the sixth consecutive top-three team finish for the Sun Devils and third team victory of the season, second in the last three outings.

STANFORD has captured four of five starts this spring, including three straight at Peg Bernard Invitational, Allstate Intercollegiate and Bruin Wave Invitational. In its most recent start, Stanford won the Silverado Showdown with a program record 54-hole score of 16-under 848 (par-72). Freshman **Albane Valenzuela** posted three straight top 10's, including season-best tie for fourth at the Bruin Wave Invitational, but has missed last two events due to injury. She represented her country at the Rio Olympics and tied for 21st to share low amateur honors.

UCLA has won three tournaments this season (Stanford Intercollegiate, Gifford Great 8 Match Play, Anuenue Spring Break Classic) along with three second-place showings and a third-place finish this season. Sophomore **Lilia Vu** has won three consecutive tournaments entering the Pac-12 Championships, just the second Bruin ever to do so. Freshman **Mariel Galdiano** has four top five finishes, including two in her last three starts entering the Pac-12 Championship.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, the defending Pac-12 Champions will look to sophomore **Robynn Ree** to lead the Trojans at the Pac-12 Championships. Head coach Andrea Gaston, in her 21st season as head coach, has put together three titles this season. Ree finds herself ranked 20th in the nation according to Golfstat.

ARIZONA, the host of the 2017 Pac-12 Championship, is coming off a second-place finish at the Ping/ASU Invitational. The Wildcats count on junior **Krystal Quihuis** (72.05 avg) and an experienced group of seven returners.

CALIFORNIA women's golf team closed out the regular season in impressive fashion, finishing tied for fourth at the Silverado Showdown. The Golden Bears are ranked No. 22 and will lean on senior **Luciana Gutierrez** (73.9 avg) as they move into post season.

COLORADO heads into the championship with momentum from a good regular season. The Buffs ended their regular season by posting the third best score in school history at the Silverado Showdown. The Buffs are lead by senior **Esther Lee** who tied for 18th place at the Pac-12 Women's Golf Championship in 2016. This season, Lee's scoring average of 73.00 has helped her secure a title in the Branch Law/Dick McGuire Invitational during the regular season.

OREGON will look to senior **Cathleen Santoso** as they advance into post season competition. Most recently, Santoso recorded a 6-under 66 in the Silverado Showdown at the Silverado Country Club. The Ducks recorded a second-place finish at the Paul Barnard Invitational this season.

WASHINGTON, the defending NCAA champion, is ranked 59th according to Golfweek leading up to the Pac-12 Championship. Head Coach Mary Lou Mulflur was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year after leading the Huskies to their first national championship in 2016. The Huskies recently finished third in the PING/ASU Invitational.

OREGON STATE women's golf team most recently shot a 2-under 286 in the final round of the PING/ASU Invitational to move up the leaderboard and finish in a tie for fifth place. The Beavers have five returners and look to win their first title of the year.

Coach Kelli Kamimura looks to move WASHINGTON STATE up the leaderboard at this year's Pac-12 Championship. Leading the Cougars into her 8th season as a head coach, WSU finished the regular season tied for 13th place with Hawaii at the Silverado Showdown.

The Pac-12 Championship will run from Monday, April 24 to Wednesday, April 26, at Sewailo Golf Club in Tucson, Arizona. For more information on the event please visit the pac-12.com.

LAST YEAR IN PAC-12 WOMEN'S GOLF

USC collected its fifth Pac-12 Conference title, posting a 54-hole total of 846 (-18), to claim the league crown. With a six-stroke lead entering the final round, USC was able to hold off its league rival, UCLA, by three strokes to capture the Pac-12 Championship title. The race for the individual title proved to be close as the top two individuals both shot 66 in their final round. ARIZONA STATE freshman Linnea Strom (-11) posted a birdie on the 18th hole to clinch the individual title by one stroke over UCLA's Bronte Law (-10). Strom also claimed the Pac-12 individual record for lowest total score of 205, edging OREGON's Caroline Inglis, who set last year's record (206).

The Pac-12 continued its dynamic play into the NCAA Regionals with nine teams earning bids; ARIZONA, ARIZONA STATE, CALIFORNIA, COLORADO, OREGON, STANFORD, UCLA, USC, and WASHINGTON. Six teams advanced to the NCAA Championship where five then qualified for Match Play; Oregon, Stanford, UCLA, USC, and Washington. In a match that was extended to extra holes against the defending champion Cardinal, the Huskies became the sixth Pac-12 team to tally a women's national golf title.

Law was named Pac-12 Golfer of the Year for the second consecutive time. The top-ranked golfer recorded a nation's best 70.61 stroke average and posted 20 rounds under par, with 11 rounds of 69 or better. UCLA's Lilia Vu secured Freshman of the Year honors after posting five top-10 finishes, 13 rounds under par, and seven rounds in the 60s. Vu also secured All-Pac-12 First Team honors. WASHINGTON's head coach Mary Lou Mulflur was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year after guiding the Huskies to their first national championship. Mulflur led a team of five freshmen and two seniors to the title where they had to take down top-ranked UCLA in the semifinals and Stanford in the championship match, to earn the 2016 NCAA Championship. The Huskies are the sixth Pac-12 women's golf program to collect a national crown.

National honors were bestowed upon Law and Mulflur as Law pulled in three player of the year awards (ANNIKA, PING WGCA and Golfweek), while Mulflur was named national coach of the year by the WGCA and Golfweek.

Law, Vu, Strom and Stanford's Lauren Kim were honored by the WGCA as First Team All-America selections, while second team honors went to Arizona State's Monica Vaughan, Colorado's Esther Lee, Stanford's Mariah Stackhouse, USC's Tiffany Chan and Robynn Ree, and Washington's Charlotte Thomas.
