NCAA REGIONAL PLAY KICKS OFF FRIDAY FOR FIVE PAC-12 BASEBALL TEAMS

Five teams earned bids to the 2014 NCAA Division I Baseball Championship. OREGON STATE received the No. 1 overall seed in the tournament, its highest in program history. The Beavers--who are making a school-record sixth-straight NCAA postseason appearance--will be hosting a regional in Corvallis for the second-straight year. ARIZONA STATE, OREGON, STANFORD and WASHINGTON all received at large bids and will travel on opening weekend, with the Sun Devils earning the No. 2 seed in the San Luis Obispo Regional, the Ducks a No. 2 seed in the Nashville Regional, the Cardinal a No. 3 seed in the Bloomington Regional and the Huskies a No. 2 seed in the Oxford Regional. The Beavers host fourth-seeded North Dakota State to open regional play on Friday, while Arizona State takes on No. 3 Pepperdine and Oregon faces No. 3 seed Clemson. Stanford--returning to the tournament after a one year-absence--will battle No. 2 Indiana State in Bloomington, Ind., while the Huskies will go up against third-seeded Georgia Tech. UW is making its first appearance in the NCAA regionals since 2004--which were also in Oxford--and will face Georgia Tech in the postseason for the third time since 1994. Oregon State clinched its second-consecutive and fourth Conference title overall since 1999 after needing just one win over the weekend at USC to earn the title. The Beavers, which previously claimed league crowns in 2006 and 2007 prior to 2013, went on to win the national championship both years. The Golden Spikes Award list was trimmed to 21 semifinalists on Tuesday, and two Pac-12 players made the cut: Oregon State junior outfielder Michael Conforto and Washington junior RHP Tyler Davis. Three teams enter the first round of postseason play ranked in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll. Oregon State sits at No. 2, followed by Washington at No. 18, and Oregon at No. 19. ARIZONA STATE also received votes in the poll. Pac-12 teams wrapped up the regular season with a 149-97-2 (.605) record against non-conference competition. HOFFPAUR NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK KAPRIELIAN TABBED PAC-12 PITCHER OF THE WEEK

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. — STANFORD right-fielder **Zach Hoffpaur** has been named Pac-12 Player of the Week and UCLA right-handed pitcher **James Kaprielian** has been tabbed Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week for the final week of the regular season, May 19-25, the Conference office announced Monday.

Hoffpaur led the offense for the Cardinal, who went 4-0 over the week, including a home sweep against league-foe Utah to finish up the regular season over the weekend. The sophomore batted a team-best .529 (9-for-17) with seven RBI, one double, two home runs and three runs scored. The starting right-fielder also posted a .556 on-base percentage and a .941 slugging percentage while extending his streak of reaching base safely to 15 games. On Friday, he became just the third Pac-12 player in 2014 to register five hits in a game with a 5-for-5 day in a 5-0 win for Stanford. Hoffpaur capped the weekend by providing go-ahead home runs in both ends of the double header at Utah on Sunday. The Glendale, Ariz. native finished the regular season seventh in the Pac-12 in batting average, registering a .339 on the year.

This is Hoffpaur's first-career Pac-12 Player of the Week honor and Stanford's 71st all-time selection. He joins teammate Danny Diekroeger as the second Cardinal to earn the weekly honor in 2014.

Kaprielian, a sophomore from Tustin, Calif., wrapped up an impressive second year of collegiate baseball by leading UCLA to a 3-0 shutout win over No. 8 Washington on the road on Friday night. The right-hander gave up just four hits and no runs while striking out 11 over eight innings of work. In the game, he retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced and logged double-digit strikeouts for the second-straight start and for the third time in last four starts. In those last four starts he posted a 1.72 ERA with 32 strikeouts in 31.1 innings pitched. Kaprielian finishes his sophomore campaign seventh in the Pac-12 in ERA with a 2.29 and first in batters struck out with 108. On the year, he allowed two runs or less in 11 of 15 starts and pitched seven innings or more eight times.

Kaprielian picks up his first-ever Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week nod and the 67th overall for the Bruins. He is the third UCLA pitcher to earn the weekly award in 2014 as teammates Cody Poteet and Grant Watson were honored earlier in the season.

PAC-12 BASEBALL NOTES

Arizona State (33-22, 19-11)

The Sun Devils wrapped up the final month of the regular season with four-consecutive Conference series victories and finished in third-place in the Pac-12 standings. ASU earned an at-large berth to the 2014 NCAA Tournament and will make its fourth appearance in the last five years. They will look to return to the College World Series for the first time since 2010, the last year they notched 19 league victories. Its eight Conference series victories in 2014 are tied for most in school history. ASU will travel to San Luis Obispo, Calif. as the No. 2 seed in the regional hosted by Cal Poly and will face No. 3 Pepperdine on Friday at 1 p.m. PT. The Sun Devils head into regional play as winners of nine of their last 10 games. They will look to the offense to continue to produce and carry them through the postseason. That group finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in the Pac-12 in batting average (.286), slugging percentage (.389) and hits (546) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.374) and runs scored (325).

Oregon (42-18, 18-12)

While the Ducks lost two of three at home to California on the final weekend of regular season play and would have liked to wrap up on a better note, the most important thing is that they heard their name called on Monday morning as the field of 64 teams was announced for the 2014 NCAA tournament. Oregon earned its third-straight trip to NCAA postseason play and fourth under head coach George Horton since the baseball program was reinstated in 2009. Oregon, who ended the season fourth in the Pac-12, is one of four Pac-12 teams traveling for the first round as they head to Nashville, Tenn. as the No. 2 seed in the regional hosted by Vanderbilt. They will take on No. 3 seed Clemson at 10 a.m. PT on Friday. As they have all season, the Ducks will rely on their pitching staff to lead the way deep into the postseason. They have been the headliners in 2014, recording a 3.03 ERA--which was good for second in the Pac-12--and a .234 opposing batting average, also good for second. Additionally, their 446 batters struck out was a Conference-best during the regular season.

Oregon State (42-12, 23-7)

The Beavers captured their second-consecutive Pac-12 championship with a win on the final weekend of the regular season, and were rewarded with the No. 1 overall national seed in the 2014 NCAA tournament. It is the highest seeding ever for OSU--a No. 8 seed in 2005 and No. 3 last season--as they will host a regional in Corvallis for the second-straight year and fifth time ever. Oregon State--who is 12-0 when hosting since 2005-- will make its 15th overall and a program-record sixth-straight NCAA appearance on Friday when they host Summit League Champion and No. 4 seed North Dakota State at 8 p.m. PT on ESPNU. The Beavers are seeking a second-consecutive trip to the College World Series and their fifth since 2005. With an impressive combination of offense, defense and pitching firepower, this OSU team is looking like a serious favorite to win it all. The offense ranked in the top-5 of the Conference in every major category, including first in on-base percentage (.384) and runs batted in (292). The excellent pitching staff was first in the Pac-12 and second in the country as a team in ERA (2.13) and owned three of the top five individual spots atop the Conference in the same category, led by lefty Ben Wetzler. The senior was first in the Pac-12 and led the country in regulars season ERA at 0.76.

Stanford (30-23, 16-14)

After a one year absence, the Cardinal return to the NCAA tournament after finishing tied for fifth in league standings. Longtime head coach Mark Marquess has his team in the postseason for the 29th time in the last 34 years. Stanford heads to the Bloomington Regional as the No. 3 seed and will face No. 2 Indiana State on Friday at 11 a.m. PT. It was the Cardinal's play over the second half of the season that solidified its at large bid as they went 19-7 in its last 26 games and 8-2 in its last 10, including four-straight league series victories to close the season. Stanford also faced one of the toughest schedules in the nation, recording 18 wins over ranked opponents and league series wins over Oregon and Arizona State. The pitching staff has been solid in 2014, with a 3.45 ERA that was fifth in the Conference while opponents hit just .235 against them--which was good for third in the league. In its 30 wins this season, Stanford outscored opponents 191-90.

Washington (39-15-1, 21-9)

Despite dropping the last two Conference series of the regular season, the Huskies finished second in the Pac-12 standings--their highest finish since 2004. That was also the last year they made an appearance in the postseason as they had gone longer than any other Pac-12 school without an NCAA bid. Coincidentally, the Huskies will return to the same regional site they played at in 2004 as they head to Oxford, Miss. as the No. 2 seed in the regional hosted by Ole Miss. They will take on No. 3 Georgia Tech in a first round game on Friday at 1 p.m. PT. UW, who is 19-16 in eight previous postseason appearances, have faced Georgia Tech twice before in the NCAA tournament, losing to them in 1994, then taking the top-seeded Rambling Wrecks down in 1997. After being picked to finish 10th in the preseason coaches poll, UW had one of its best years and will look to make its first College World Series appearance in program history. Washington was well-balanced on all sides of the ball as they owned the Conference's best fielding percentage (.981), second-best batting average (.280) and slugging percentage (.383) and third-best ERA (3.23).

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

-The Pac-12 has been represented in each of the last 17 College World Series. Since 1996, at least one Conference squad has made every trip to Omaha.

-The Conference has advanced two teams to the College World Series each of the last two years, with Arizona (2012) and UCLA (2013) winning the last two. Dating back to Oregon State's back-to-back championships in 2006 & 2007, a Pac-12 school has won four of the last eight CWS titles.

-The five Conference teams in the field account for 44 College World appearances (ASU-22, OSU-5, STAN-16 and ORE-1) and seven national championships (ASU-5, OSU-2) between them.

FIVE PAC-12 BASEBALL TEAMS RECEIVE NCAA BIDS

WALNUT CREEK, Calif.— ARIZONA STATE, OREGON, OREGON STATE, STANFORD and WASHINGTON have been selected to the 64-team field for the 2014 NCAA Division I Baseball Championship, as announced by the NCAA selection committee on Monday.

In the Corvallis regional, the No. 1 overall seed and top-seeded Beavers (42-12) will open with Summit League Champion North Dakota State (25-24) at 8 p.m. PT on ESPNU. Second-seeded UNLV (35-23) and third-seeded UC Irvine (35-22) round out the rest of the regional. OSU is in the postseason for the ninth time in the last 10 years.

Arizona State (33-22) is the second seed in the San Luis Obispo Regional, hosted by No. 1 seed Cal Poly (45-10). The Sun Devils start off with three-seed Pepperdine (39-16) on Friday at 1 p.m. PT on ESPNU. In the other half of the bracket, the host Mustangs take on fourth-seeded Sacramento State (39-22).

Oregon (42-18) is the No. 2 seed in the Nashville Regional hosted by Vanderbilt, where the Ducks will take on third-seeded Clemson (36-23) at 10 a.m. PT on ESPN3. Following that game will be host and top-seeded Vanderbilt (41-18) facing fourth-seeded Xavier (29-27).

Stanford (30-23) will head to Bloomington, Ind. as the third seed in the regional hosted by one-seed Indiana (42-13). The Cardinal open up postseason play against two-seed Indiana State (35-16) at 11 a.m. PT on ESPN3. In the other half of the bracket, the top-seeded Hoosiers face Youngstown State (16-36) in the second game in Bloomington on Friday. This will be Stanford's 29th appearance in the NCAA tournament in the past 34 years under coach Mark Marquess.

Washington (39-15-1), the Pac-12 runner up, earned the two seed in the Oxford Regional hosted by Ole Miss (41-18). The Huskies will play three-seed Georgia Tech (36-24) at 1 p.m. PT on ESPN3 while No. 1 Mississippi will face fourth-seed Jacksonville State (36-25). UW is making its first appearance in the NCAA postseason since 2004.

Each of the 16 regionals features four teams, playing a double-elimination format. The regionals are scheduled from Friday, May 30, to Monday, June 2 (if necessary). Selection of the eight super regional hosts will be announced on NCAA.com on June 2 at approximately 8 p.m. PT.

The 68th Men's College World Series starts Saturday, June 14, at the TD Ameritrade Park Omaha in Omaha, Neb.

2013 POSTSEASON IN REVIEW

UCLA rolled through its competition in June, going 10-0 in the postseason to capture its first-ever national title. Four Conference squads earned regional berths for the NCAA Championship in 2013, with OREGON, OREGON STATE and UCLA serving as first round hosts. ARIZONA STATE earned the No. 2 seed in the Fullerton Regional. OREGON STATE and UCLA advanced to super regional play, and both went on to reach the CWS. It marked the second-straight year that a pair of Pac-12 teams reached the round of eight in Omaha.

REGULAR SEASON WRAP UP

Arizona (22-33, 9-21)

The Wildcats wrapped up the 2014 regular season on a winning note, taking two of three from Abilene Christian to win the series. While the pitching struggled, the offense was solid in 2014, ranking in the middle or near the top in nearly every major offensive statistical category, including batting average (.280, 3rd), on-base pct (.362, 4th), runs scored (286, 5th), hits (527, 2nd) and runs batted in (252, 5th). Individually, Arizona had two hitters in the top-8 in batting average in the Pac-12, led by Scott Kingery's .354 average, which was good for fifth.

California (26-27, 13-17)

The Bears may not have made the postseason, but they did finish May strong, winning seven of their last nine, including taking two of three from Oregon on the final weekend. Overall, the struggles this season and below .500 record was in part to facing a tough schedule with half their games against ranked teams, including a stretch of three of four series against ranked Conference opponents. The offense was led by Devon Rodriguez and Derek Campbell, who hit at a .284 and .266 clip, respectively.

UCLA (25-30-1, 12-18)

The 2013 NCAA National Champions unfortunately won't get a chance to defend their title this year; however they did take two of three at No. 8 Washington on the final weekend. It was an injury riddled season for the Bruins, who have had five regular starters miss time due to injury in addition to All-American closer David Berg missing more than a month due to a bicep strain. The misfortune of injuries forced a variety of lineups and pushed inexperienced players on to the field and into the batters box--which should bode well for next year. A bright spot this year for UCLA was right hander James Kaprielian, who has had a stellar sophomore campaign with a team-leading 2.29 ERA and a Conference-best 108 strikeouts.

USC (29-24, 16-14)

Despite missing the postseason, USC had one of their strongest seasons in years, finishing fifth after being picked to finish ninth. The Trojans were one of the first four teams left out of the 2014 bracket, the closest they've been to the tournament since 2005. A bright spot for USC this year was the offense, led by seniors Jake Hernandez and Kevin Swick, who hit at a .327 and .299 clip, respectively.

Utah (16-36, 4-26)

While the Utes may have struggled this year, but they did get some strong production on the offensive side of the plate from sophomore outfielder Wyler Smith and senior infielder TJ Bennett, who combined for 104 hits and 48 RBI on the year.

Washington State (24-30, 14-16)

WSU turned in a solid season with a relatively young roster--making the future look bright for the Cougars. A particular highlight this year for the WSU relief staff was freshman closer Ian Hamilton. In his first season of college baseball, he led the Conference with 15 saves--a mark that was tied for seventh in the country at the end of the regular season.

PAC-12 COACHES PICK OREGON STATE AS 2014 FAVORITE

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. — In a polling of the Pac-12's baseball coaches, defending Conference champion OREGON STATE has been selected as the preseason favorite to win the conference title again this season. The Beavers received nine of 10 possible first-place votes and 98 points. Oregon State finished the 2013 campaign with a 52-12 record and advanced to the College World Series where they finished tied for third. The Beavers, led by preseason All-Americans Michael Conforto, Dylan Davis, Andrew Moore, Ben Wetzler and Scott Schultz, enter the season as a consensus top-5 team in the national rankings.

OREGON, a Conference runner-up for two-consecutive years, came in second with 86 votes and received one first-place vote. UCLA, fresh off their first College World Series title in program history, tallied 84 points and received the final first-place vote to come in at third place. ARIZONA STATE, a 2013 post-season participant, finished fourth in the balloting, collected 73 points. ARIZONA received 61 points to round out the top five.

STANFORD finished sixth in the polling, picking up 60 points, and CALIFORNIA's 38 points were good for seventh. WASHINGTON STATE collected 35 points to nab the eighth spot in the poll, while USC came in ninth with 33 points. WASHINGTON, which picked up 22 points, was tabbed to finish 10th followed by Utah at the 11 spot with 14 points.

All 11 teams will be in action on Friday, Feb. 14 as the 2014 season gets under way. Pac-12 play starts Friday, March 14.

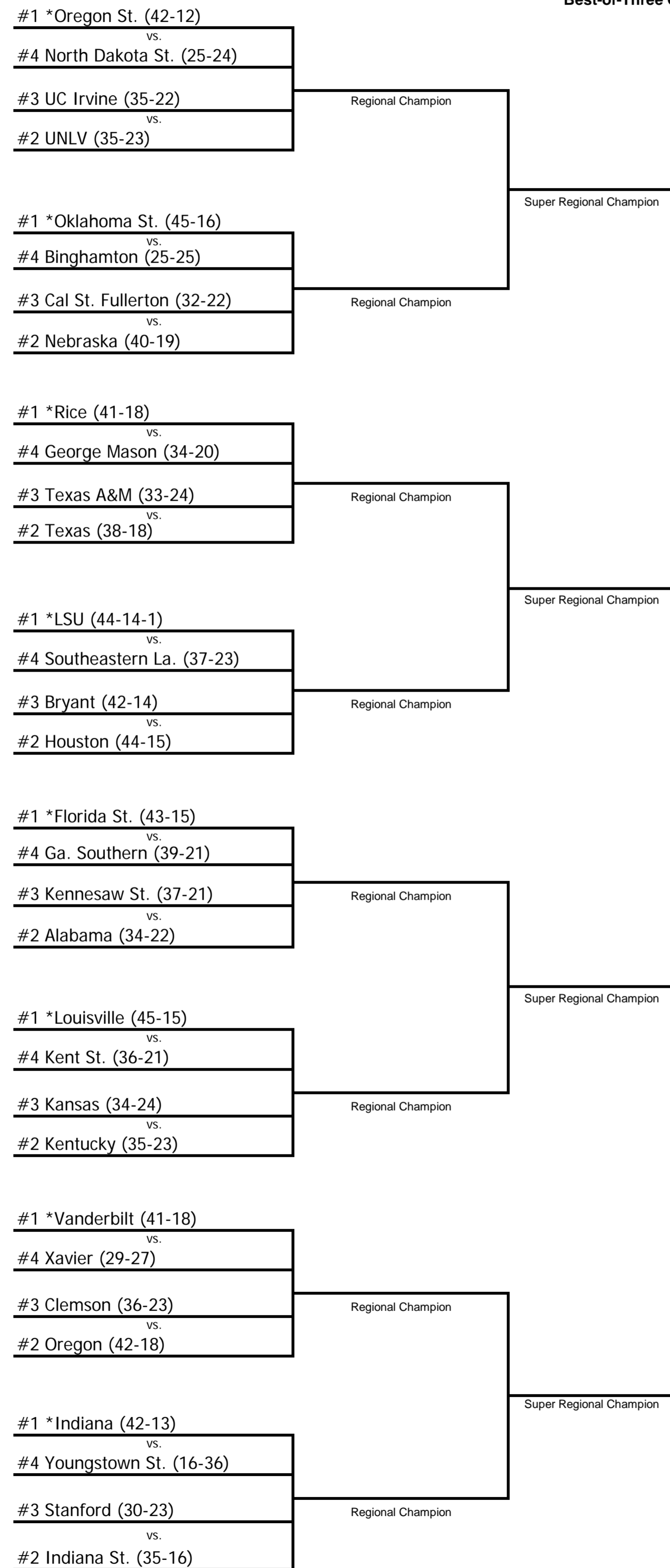

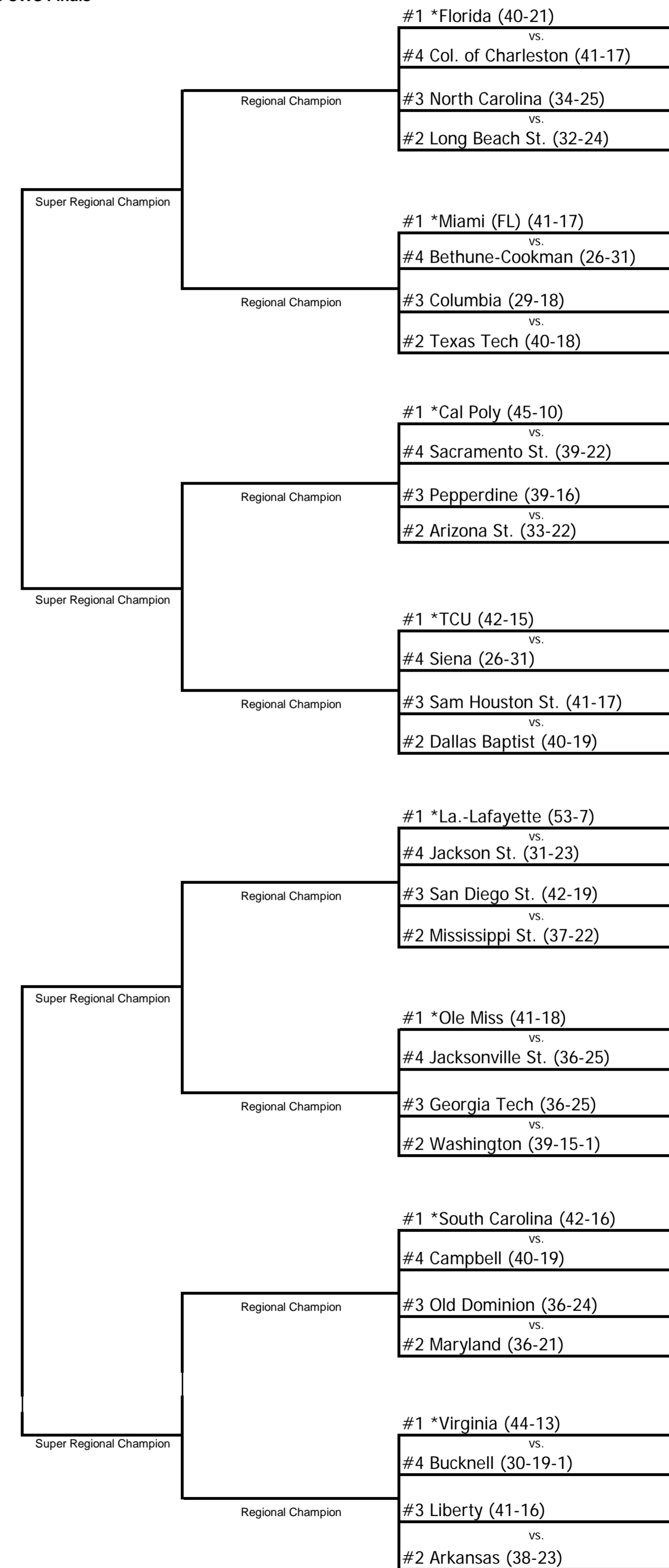
