## STANFORD STILL STANDING, WILL REPRESENT PAC-12 BASEBALL IN SUPER REGIONALS

In one of the most unpredictable regional rounds of the Division I Baseball Championships since the NCAA adopted the current format in 1999, five of the eight national seeds failed to advance to the Super Regional round, including No. 1 overall seed and two-time Pac-12 Champion OREGON STATE. It was just the second time that many national seeds had lost in regional play and only the second time the top seed in the tournament had failed to make it out of its own regional. While OREGON and WASHINGTON fought hard against SEC foes Vanderbilt and Ole Miss, they couldn't pull out the close games that they needed to reach the field of 16. ARIZONA STATE, who had won nine of 10 entering the weekend, couldn't sustain the momentum and dropped two-straight to make an early exit. In a surprise turn of events, STANFORD, who finished tied for fifth in the Pac-12 standings and was widely considered one of the last few teams to get an at-large bid, contributed to the wild and wacky weekend by winning the Bloomington Regional and carry the torch for Pac-12 Baseball into the next round. It took two come-from-behind efforts in elimination games to beat host Indiana, capped by a two-run walk-off home run by freshman Tommy Edman--the regional's most outstanding player. The Cardinal hit an opening round-best nine home runs over five games to shock the Hoosiers. Stanford will now travel to Nashville to face Vanderbilt for a three-game set from Friday-Sunday with all three games televised live on ESPN2. The Cardinal, who are making a second trip to Nashville in 2014, will try to reverse the outcome of the first series in which they dropped all three games. The Golden Spikes Award list was trimmed three finalists Tuesday, and two-time Pac-12 Player of the Year Michael Conforto (Jr., OF, Oregon State) made the cut. The winner will be announced on June 17.

## PAC-12 BASEBALL NOTES

### Stanford (34-24, 16-14)

Stanford, who finished tied for fifth in Conference, used a two-run walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth to take down the Bloomington regional host Indiana as the three-seed and advance to Super Regionals. After losing to the Hoosiers on day two, the Cardinal would need to win three in a row, including two against the hometown team to advance. That's exactly what they did behind a slew of home runs that helped Stanford to come-from-behind wins in back-to-back elimination games against the Hoosiers. Indiana had been 39-0 when leading after the seventh before giving up late leads to the Cardinal in both the losses. Stanford now represents the only Pac-12 team remaining in postseason play as they try to extend the Conference's streak of 17-straight College World Series appearances as well as make the program's first appearance since 2008. It won't be an easy road, however, as they will have to travel to Nashville to take on Vanderbilt for a second-time this season for a three-game series from Friday-Sunday (if necessary). In the first series back in early March, the Commodores swept the three-game set at home; however, that was well before Stanford made vast improvements during the second half of the season. The team has gone 23-8 in its last 31 games and 8-2 in its last 10. That stretch included four-straight league series victories to close the season. Stanford is a battle-tested team as it faced one of the toughest schedules in the nation, recording 18 regular season wins over ranked opponents and league series wins over Oregon and Arizona State. The Cardinal really stepped it up on regional weekend, batting .303 with nine home runs in five games--marks that ranked sixth and first out of the 64 teams that participated in regional play. All three Stanford-Vanderbilt games will air on ESPN2 this weekend.

### NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

-The Pac-12 has been represented in each of the last 17 College World Series. Since 1996, at least one Conference squad has made every trip to Omaha.

-The Conference has advanced two teams to the College World Series each of the last two years, with Arizona (2012) and UCLA (2013) winning the last two. Dating back to Oregon State's back-to-back championships in 2006 & 2007, a Pac-12 school has won four of the last eight CWS titles.

-Stanford, the Conference's lone remaining team in the Super Regional field account has made 16 appearances in the College World Series.

-The Pac-12 has produced at least three 40-win teams in six of the last eight seasons. Oregon State (45) has reached the plateau five times during that stretch, while Oregon (48) has won at least 40 games four times since the program was reinstated in 2009. Washington (41) won 40 plus games for the first time since 2003 and reached the plateau for just the fifth time in school history.

-Fourteen Pac-12 players were named to All-Regional teams following last week's action, and one was named Most Outstanding Player of their respective regionals. The list is as follows:

-The 2014 MLB Draft will be held Thursday, June 5 - Saturday, June 7 (Thu: Rounds 1-2; Fri: Rounds 3-10; Sat. Rounds 11-40). The Pac-12 has produced 29 first round draft picks since 2006 and has seen at least one player come off the board in the first round every year during that span, including the first overall pick in 2013.

### FIVE PAC-12 BASEBALL TEAMS RECEIVE NCAA BIDS

**WALNUT CREEK, Calif.**— ARIZONA STATE, OREGON, OREGON STATE, STANFORD and WASHINGTON have been selected to the 64-team field for the 2014 NCAA Division I Baseball Championship, as announced by the NCAA selection committee on Monday.

In the Corvallis regional, the No. 1 overall seed and top-seeded Beavers (42-12) will open with Summit League Champion North Dakota State (25-24) at 8 p.m. PT on ESPNU. Second-seeded UNLV (35-23) and third-seeded UC Irvine (35-22) round out the rest of the regional. OSU is in the postseason for the ninth time in the last 10 years.

Arizona State (33-22) is the second seed in the San Luis Obispo Regional, hosted by No. 1 seed Cal Poly (45-10). The Sun Devils start off with three-seed Pepperdine (39-16) on Friday at 1 p.m. PT on ESPNU. In the other half of the bracket, the host Mustangs take on fourth-seeded Sacramento State (39-22).

Oregon (42-18) is the No. 2 seed in the Nashville Regional hosted by Vanderbilt, where the Ducks will take on third-seeded Clemson (36-23) at 10 a.m. PT on ESPN3. Following that game will be host and top-seeded Vanderbilt (41-18) facing fourth-seeded Xavier (29-27).

Stanford (30-23) will head to Bloomington, Ind. as the third seed in the regional hosted by one-seed Indiana (42-13). The Cardinal open up postseason play against two-seed Indiana State (35-16) at 11 a.m. PT on ESPN3. In the other half of the bracket, the top-seeded Hoosiers face Youngstown State (16-36) in the second game in Bloomington on Friday. This will be Stanford's 29th appearance in the NCAA tournament in the past 34 years under coach Mark Marquess.

Washington (39-15-1), the Pac-12 runner up, earned the two seed in the Oxford Regional hosted by Ole Miss (41-18). The Huskies will play three-seed Georgia Tech (36-24) at 1 p.m. PT on ESPN3 while No. 1 Mississippi will face fourth-seed Jacksonville State (36-25). UW is making its first appearance in the NCAA postseason since 2004.

Each of the 16 regionals features four teams, playing a double-elimination format. The regionals are scheduled from Friday, May 30, to Monday, June 2 (if necessary). Selection of the eight super regional hosts will be announced on NCAA.com on June 2 at approximately 8 p.m. PT.

The 68th Men's College World Series starts Saturday, June 14, at the TD Ameritrade Park Omaha in Omaha, Neb.

### 2013 POSTSEASON IN REVIEW

UCLA rolled through its competition in June, going 10-0 in the postseason to capture its first-ever national title. Four Conference squads earned regional berths for the NCAA Championship in 2013, with OREGON, OREGON STATE and UCLA serving as first round hosts. ARIZONA STATE earned the No. 2 seed in the Fullerton Regional. OREGON STATE and UCLA advanced to super regional play, and both went on to reach the CWS. It marked the second-straight year that a pair of Pac-12 teams reached the round of eight in Omaha.

## SEASON WRAP UP

### Arizona (22-33, 9-21)

The Wildcats wrapped up the 2014 regular season on a winning note, taking two of three from Abilene Christian to win the series. While the pitching struggled, the offense was solid in 2014, ranking in the middle or near the top in nearly every major offensive statistical category, including batting average (.280, 3rd), on-base pct (.362, 4th), runs scored (286, 5th), hits (527, 2nd) and runs batted in (252, 5th). Individually, Arizona had two hitters in the top-8 in batting average in the Pac-12, led by Scott Kingery's .354 average, which was good for fifth.

### Arizona State (33-24, 19-11)

The Sun Devils made its fourth appearance in the NCAA Championship bracket in the last five years, but lost two close one-run games as they were eliminated from play. ASU finished third in the Pac-12 regular season standings thanks to four-straight league series wins to end the regular season. They headed into regional play as winners of nine of their last 10 games, but could extend that to the postseason. The offense was the headliner this year as they finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in the Pac-12 in batting average (.286), slugging percentage (.389) and hits (546) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.374) and runs scored (325).

### California (26-27, 13-17)

The Bears may not have made the postseason, but they did finish May strong, winning seven of their last nine, including taking two of three from Oregon on the final weekend. Overall, the struggles this season and below .500 record was in part to facing a tough schedule with half their games against ranked teams, including a stretch of three of four series against ranked Conference opponents. The offense was led by Devon Rodriguez and Derek Campbell, who hit at a .284 and .266 clip, respectively.

### Oregon (44-20, 18-12)

The Ducks, who finished fourth in the Pac-12, made their third-straight NCAA postseason appearance over the weekend and fourth overall under head Coach George Horton since the program was reinstated in 2009. Playing in Nashville, Oregon won game one in blowout fashion by a score of 18-1 over Clemson, but couldn't get past tournament-host Vanderbilt as they fell 7-2 and 3-2 in two games against the Commodores. The Ducks were led by their pitching staff in 2014, who recorded a 3.03 ERA in the regular season--which was good for second in the Pac-12--and a .234 opposing batting average, also good for second. Additionally, their 446 batters struck out was a Conference-best during the regular season.

### Oregon State (45-14, 23-7)

The back-to-back Pac-12 Champions earned their highest seed ever as they were the No. 1 overall seed heading into regional play in Corvallis on opening weekend of the NCAA Championships. Making a school-record sixth-straight appearance in postseason play and hosting for the second-straight year, the Beavers were one of many high seeds who fell victim to the pressure of lofty expectations. After losing the second game to UC Irvine, OSU couldn't beat the Anteaters two more times to reach the Super Regional round. Despite the disappointing end, it was a tremendous year for the Beavers, who were a well balanced team led by an excellent pitching staff. That group ended the regular season first in the Pac-12 and second in the country as a team in ERA (2.13) and owned three of the top five individual spots atop the Conference in the same category, led by lefty Ben Wetzler. The senior was first in the Pac-12 and led the country in the regular season ERA at 0.76.

### UCLA (25-30-1, 12-18)

The 2013 NCAA National Champions unfortunately won't get a chance to defend their title this year; however they did take two of three at No. 8 Washington on the final weekend. It was an injury riddled season for the Bruins, who have had five regular starters miss time due to injury in addition to All-American closer David Berg missing more than a month due to a bicep strain. The misfortune of injuries forced a variety of lineups and pushed inexperienced players on to the field and into the batters box--which should bode well for next year. A bright spot this year for UCLA was right hander James Kaprielian, who has had a stellar sophomore campaign with a team-leading 2.29 ERA and a Conference-best 108 strikeouts.

### USC (29-24, 16-14)

Despite missing the postseason, USC had one of their strongest seasons in years, finishing fifth after being picked to finish ninth. The Trojans were one of the first four teams left out of the 2014 bracket, the closest they've been to the tournament since 2005. A bright spot for USC this year was the offense, led by seniors Jake Hernandez and Kevin Swick, who hit at a .327 and .299 clip, respectively.

### Utah (16-36, 4-26)

While the Utes may have struggled this year, but they did get some strong production on the offensive side of the plate from sophomore outfielder Wyler Smith and senior infielder TJ Bennett, who combined for 104 hits and 48 RBI on the year.

### Washington (41-17-1, 21-9)

UW made its ninth NCAA postseason appearance in school history and first in 10 years, but the team was unable to advance to Super Regionals with host Ole Miss edging them out in two close games to win and advance. It was the most wins for the Huskies since 2003 and marked just the fifth time the program reached that plateau. Washington was well-balanced on all sides of the ball this year as they owned the Conference's best fielding percentage (.981), second-best batting average (.280) and slugging percentage (.383) and third-best ERA (3.23) during the regular season.

### Washington State (24-30, 14-16)

WSU turned in a solid season with a relatively young roster--making the future look bright for the Cougars. A particular highlight this year for the WSU relief staff was freshman closer Ian Hamilton. In his first season of college baseball, he led the Conference with 15 saves--a mark that was tied for seventh in the country at the end of the regular season.

## PAC-12 COACHES PICK OREGON STATE AS 2014 FAVORITE

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. — In a polling of the Pac-12's baseball coaches, defending Conference champion OREGON STATE has been selected as the preseason favorite to win the conference title again this season. The Beavers received nine of 10 possible first-place votes and 98 points. Oregon State finished the 2013 campaign with a 52-12 record and advanced to the College World Series where they finished tied for third. The Beavers, led by preseason All-Americans Michael Conforto, Dylan Davis, Andrew Moore, Ben Wetzler and Scott Schultz, enter the season as a consensus top-5 team in the national rankings.

OREGON, a Conference runner-up for two-consecutive years, came in second with 86 votes and received one first-place vote. UCLA, fresh off their first College World Series title in program history, tallied 84 points and received the final first-place vote to come in at third place. ARIZONA STATE, a 2013 post-season participant, finished fourth in the balloting, collected 73 points. ARIZONA received 61 points to round out the top five.

STANFORD finished sixth in the polling, picking up 60 points, and CALIFORNIA's 38 points were good for seventh. WASHINGTON STATE collected 35 points to nab the eighth spot in the poll, while USC came in ninth with 33 points. WASHINGTON, which picked up 22 points, was tabbed to finish 10th followed by Utah at the 11 spot with 14 points.

All 11 teams will be in action on Friday, Feb. 14 as the 2014 season gets under way. Pac-12 play starts Friday, March 14.

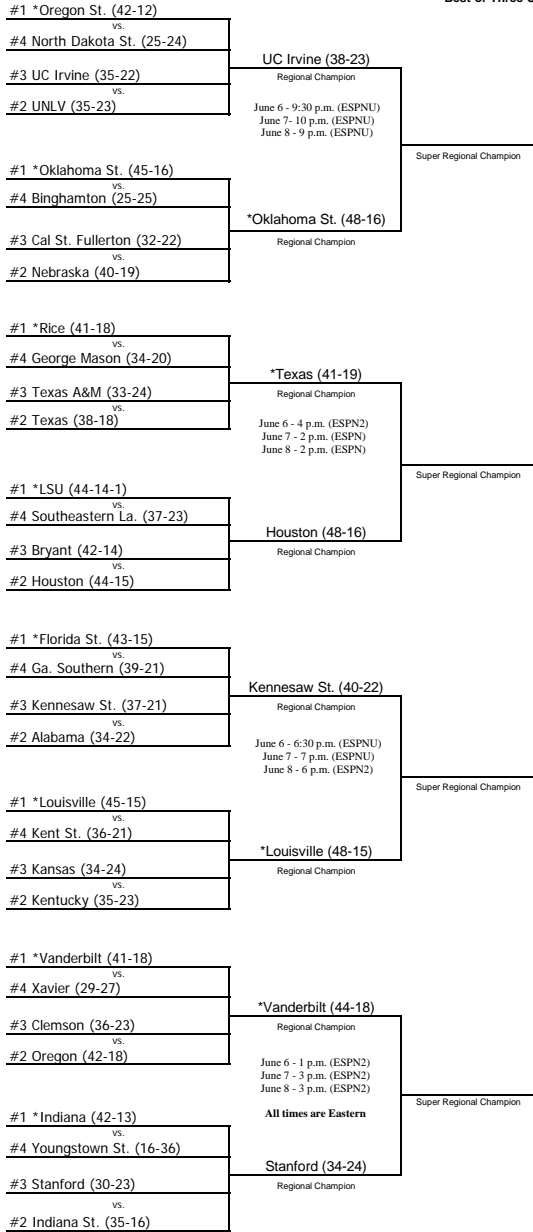

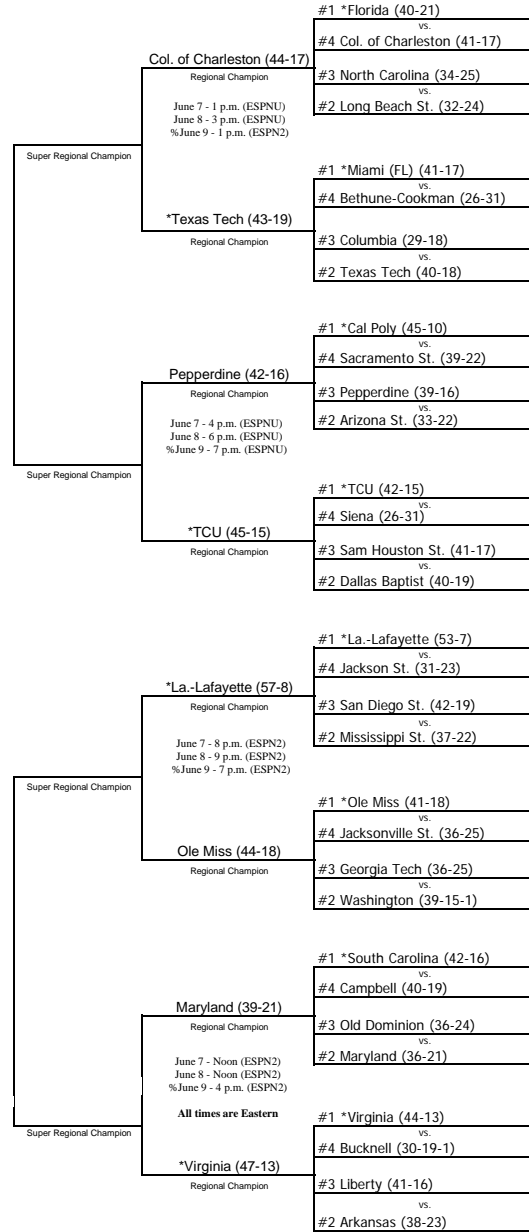
